PROCEDURE FOR HEARINGS - LICENSING ACT 2003

The Licensing Committee

The full Licensing Committee consists of fifteen elected Members of the Council. From this full Committee will be drawn sub-committees of three members to deal with licensing functions under the Licensing Act 2003. The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Licensing Committee shall have the discretion to refer a matter up to a hearing of the full Licensing Committee.

Officers at Hearings

- The Committee Officer introduces all parties and records the proceedings
- **The Legal Adviser** provides independent advice to the Members on legal matters and procedure.
- **The Licensing Officer** will introduce the matter and outline the application; the officer will also answer any questions Members may have.

PROCEDURE

NOTE: If the Sub-Committee has not already elected a Chairman, that will be the first item of business.

1	Chairman	The Chairman will: (i) call the matter to be considered; (ii) call for any declarations of interest; (iii) ask all parties to introduce themselves; (iv) summarise the procedure to be followed at the hearing; (v) will consider any request made by a party for another person to appear at the hearing; (v) will advise the parties of any maximum period of time in which it has to present its case (if a maximum is imposed this shall be equal for all parties).
2	Licensing Officer	Will introduce and summarise the application, highlighting areas of contention or dispute.
3	Committee Members	May ask questions of the Licensing Officer
4	Applicant	Will present his/her case, calling witnesses, as appropriate. (If necessary, applicant will produce any notices required by law. Legal Adviser will draw attention to this if required.)
5	Responsible Authorities (who have made representations)	Each in turn may ask <u>questions</u> of the applicant, by way of clarification.

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6	Local residents (ie. defined as "interested parties")	To be invited to ask <u>questions</u> of the applicant, by way of clarification.									
	"interested parties")	It is normal practice for a spokesperson only to speak on behalf of a group of residents.									
7	Committee Members	Each in turn may ask <u>questions</u> of the applicant.									
8	Applicant	May make a <u>statement</u> or ask his witnesses to clarify any matters which he feels are unclear, or may have been misunderstood.									
9	Responsible Authorities	Will make their representations.									
10	Applicant	Or his representative or witnesses to ask <u>questions</u> of Responsible Authorities represented at the meeting, by way of clarification.									
11	Local residents (ie. defined as "interested parties")	May ask <u>questions</u> of the Responsible Authorities represented at the meeting, by way of clarification. (Note: This is not the point at which local residents should be stating their objections.)									
12	Committee Members	May ask <u>questions</u> of the Responsible Authorities represented at the meeting									
13	Local residents (ie. defined as "interested parties")	The local residents who are objecting to the application will be invited to make observations on the application and present the bases of their objections.									
15	Applicant	Or his representative or witnesses may ask <u>questions</u> of the Local Residents, by way of clarification.									
16	Committee Members	May ask <u>questions</u> of the Local Residents.									
17	Chairman	To invite both Responsible Authorities and Local Residents to make their closing addresses.									
18	Applicant	Or his representative will <u>briefly summarise the application</u> and comment on the observations and any suggested conditions.									
19	Committee	Will retire to consider the application. The Committee may request the Legal Advisor to advise on legal issues.									
20	Committee	Will return to give its decision, with reasons, which will be announced by the Chairman and subsequently confirmed in writing to the applicant and to all the parties that made representations.									

In cases where a decision cannot be given at the hearing, parties will be advised of the decision working days.	
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<u>Notes</u>

- 1. The hearing shall normally be held in public. There may be occasions on which the Committee find it necessary to exclude members of the press and public; any such decision will be taken on the basis that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing taking place in public.
- 2. The Chairman may require any person behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or (b) permit him/her to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify, but any such person may submit in writing any information which they would have been entitled to provide orally if they had not been required to leave.
- 3. Prior to the hearing each party shall have given notification and served documentation (eg statements of witnesses or reports of experts) as required. Late representations and evidence will only be considered with the agreement of all parties.
- 4. Anyone entitled to be heard may be represented by any person, whether or not that person is legally qualified.
- 5. Hearsay will be permitted but the Sub-Committee will be reminded to give it appropriate weight.
- 6. Due note shall be taken of the provisions of the Hearings Regulations 2005.
- 7. The Chair may, in the interests of expediency or convenience of the parties, vary the procedure from time to time, provided notice is given to the parties and the rules of natural justice are observed.

SUMMARY OF PROCEDURE

- **2** Chairman to call for declarations of interest and request that all parties introduce themselves.
- 3 Chairman summarises the procedure for the hearing
- 4 The Licensing Officer summarises the application

- Applicant to be questioned by all parties (to clarify points only) following which, he/she can clarify any other matters which he/she feels may have been misunderstood when the application was presented.
- 7 Applicant to be questioned by the Committee.
- **8** Responsible Authorities to make their representations following which they can be questioned by all parties by way of clarification.
- **9 Local residents** (defined as interested parties) will be invited to present the bases of their objections, following which they can be questioned by all parties by way of clarification.
- 10 The applicant will be invited to sum up his/her case
- 11 Committee/Sub-Committee withdraws to make its decision
- 12 Committee/Sub-Committee returns to announce its decision to all present.

1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 The purpose of the report is to provide details of an application for the review of a Premise Licence under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 (appendix A). It outlines the current licence authorisations together with the evidence presented by the parties in relation to the review.

2.0 Decision Required

- 2.1 The Licensing Committee is requested to:
- 2.1.1 consider the review application and any relevant representations received; and
- 2.1.2 determine what steps, if any it considers are necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 3.0 Financial Implications for Transition Costs

- 4.0 Financial Implications 2009/10 and beyond
- 4.1 None

5.0 Legal Implications

5.1 Where application for a review under section 51 is made, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing within 20 working days to consider the application and any relevant representations received.

Section 52 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that before determining the application, the authority must hold a hearing to consider it and any relevant representations.

The authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such of the steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

- a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
- b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
- d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- e) to revoke the licence;

6.0 Risk Assessment

6.1 The Environmental Health made an application for review under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance. The Committee is requested to consider what steps (if any) are required to prevent future harm to the licensing objectives. (**Appendix A**)

Appendix A1 contains supporting evidence for the application for review, which is referred to in the application.

7.0 Background and Options

Background

- 7.1 The Music Box (formerly known as The Lion and Bell) applied in 2005 to convert their existing licence to a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 7.2 The licence authorises the following club activities:

Supply of Alcohol
Exhibition of a film
Performance of a play
Indoor sporting events
Performance of live music
Performance of recorded music
Dancing
Making music
Provision of facilities for dancing

The times the certificate authorises the carrying out of those activities are:

Monday to Wednesday	11:00 – 23:00
Thursday	11.00 - 00:00
Friday & Saturday	11:00 – 01:00
Sunday	12.00 - 22.30

Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of Bank Holiday weekends, Christmas Eve and Boxing Day until 01:00

The beginning of New Years Eve to the end of New Years Day.

A copy of the licence is attached to the report (**Appendix B**)

7.3 The premise licence holder is Enterprise Inns Plc of 3 Monspath Hall Road, Shirley Solihull. B90 4SJ. The designated premises supervisor (DPS) is Mr Lee Sean Hulme.

The premise first came to the attention of the Environmental Health team on 9th January 2009. Following the receipt of two independent noise complaints, the standard (Environmental Health) procedure was implemented; the complainants were requested to complete diary sheets for monitoring purposes. The Premise Licence holder and DPS were both notified of the complaints.

Since that time, the premises are continuing to regularly allow entertainment noise to emanate from the building, in particular, live bands. This is despite a Section 80 Abatement Notice being served upon the premises under the provisions of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. (**Appendix C**)

Appendix C1 contains additional documents relating to the Section 80 Abatement Notice.

- 7.4 Within the prescribed consultation period in relation to the review, the council received no further letters of representation from members of the public or responsible authorities.
- 7.5 In reviewing the Premises licence and making its decision, the Licensing Committee must have regard to representations made by the Premises Licence holder and any representations received from responsible authorities or interested parties. The Committee is required to take such steps (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, including a decision as to whether any such steps incorporate the interim measure imposed on the Premises Licence.

Recent events leading upto this request for a review began on the 9th January 2009 when two complaints were received from separate residential properties in connection with amplified music (in particular live bands playing at the premises) emanating from the Music Box premises so as to cause disturbance to them within their properties.

- 9th January 2009: The standard complaint procedure was followed in that a letter was sent to each complaint requesting they maintain a diary sheet of events recording dates and times they were affected by noise from the premises, additionally a letter was sent to the premises on the 9th January 2009 and Enterprise Inns, Solihull.
- 13th January 2009: reply received from Enterprise Inns, Solihull in which they state that such matters of noise emanating from the premises are the responsibility of the licensee
- 5th February 2009: Follow up letters were sent requesting diary sheets back from both complainants.
- 25th February 2009: Phone calls received from complaints and spoke of nature of problem and that live music is played too loud compared to normal music.
- 26th February 2009: Visit to the premises regarding the complaints and also issues in relation to noise from live music and how to keep windows, doors closed during music events to contain the noise from the premises.
- 7th March 2009 (Saturday night): Reports of live music from a complainant (could hear a band in the background whilst a message was left on my phone at 22:11, 22:23 and 22:25).
- 14th March 2009 (Saturday night): Reports of live music from a complainant (could hear a band in the background whilst a message was left on my phone at 22:08 and 23:05).
- 4th April 2009 (Saturday night): Reports of live music from a complainant (could hear a band in the background and identify the songs played by the band whilst a message was left on my phone at 19:42 and 23:20).
- 22nd April 2009: Transcript of a digital audio tape recording installed in a complainants property reveals music from a live band so loud that you can identify the songs.
- 1st May 2009: Transcript of another digital audio tape recording installed in a complainants property reveals music from a live band so loud that you can identify the songs
- 26th May 2009: Reports of live music from a complainant (could hear a band in the background whilst a message was left on my phone at 22:18).
- 29th May 2009: Personal visit to premises to discuss issues with Mr Lee Hulme. Specifically discussed volume of music clearly audible at residential properties, the necessity to keep windows and doors closed and to reduce the volume of the music.

- 6th June 2009 (Saturday night): I undertook a visit around the area of premises (Mill Street, Congleton) between 23:20 and 23:55, noise of amplified live music loud and clearly audible at residential façades in South Street, Holford Street and Antrobus Street, Congleton.
- 9th June 2009: Letter sent to premises and Enterprise Inns, Solihull stating that a Statutory Nuisance exists from the premises owing to the volume of the music. Additionally I enclosed the following paragraphs:-
- "....I wish to give you **7 days** from the date of this letter, in which to provide Cheshire East Council with a written scheme of mitigation to attenuate the music / entertainment noise emanating from you premises. It may be appropriate to consult not only with Enterprise Inns PLC, 3 Monkspath Hall Road, Shirley, Solihull, B90 4SJ, but also appoint an Acoustic Engineer who can provide you with the appropriate engineering solution and mitigation measures that you shall require in order to abate the noise nuisance.

However, should you fail to take this opportunity then the above mentioned Abatement Notice shall be served on you as the person responsible and any subsequent breaches of the notice shall be subject to potential prosecution by Cheshire East Council and in addition your Premises Licence LAPRE/1227/05 shall be reviewed by this department in view of the breaches of Condition 4 in Annex 2 namely: Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties."

- 10th June 2009: reply received from Enterprise Inns, Solihull in which they state that such matters of noise emanating from the premises are the responsibility of the licensee
- 22nd June 2009: Written report not received from either Enterprise Inns, Solihull or Mr Hulme as requested, therefore a Section 80 Abatement Notice was served under the provisions of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 by post upon Mr Lee Sean Hulme (the Designated Premises Supervisor) and The Company Secretary of Enterprise Inns PLC (the holder of the premises licensee).
- 24th June 2009: reply received from Enterprise Inns, Solihull in which they state that such matters of noise emanating from the premises are the responsibility of the licensee.
- 4th July 2009 (Saturday night): I undertook a visit around the area of the premises between 22:55 and 23:30. No live music audible from the Music Box but premises open and having a disco rather than live music.
- 23rd July 2009: transcript of another digital audio tape recording installed in a complainants property to monitor for notice breach reveals music from a live band so loud that you can identify the songs and is a clear indication that despite several and an Abatement Notice served on both Enterprise Inns and Mr Lee Sean Hulme they have had little or no effect and this is why a review of the licence is being sought rather than prosecution for breaches of the notice first.

RE: ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT 1990

I regret to inform you that a complaint has been received by this Division alleging noise nuisance arising from amplified music emanating from your premises.

As you may imagine, Environmental Health receive many complaints of this nature, some of which are found, upon investigation, to be unjustified. However, as we have a statutory obligation to respond to all complaints received, I am currently writing to you informally to ask for your co-operation in this matter.

I would ask you to consider whether or not any of your actions could give rise to a noise nuisance and if so, what action you could take to minimise any noise disturbance from your premises and so negate the need for a formal investigation by this Division.

Where necessary however, this Division will begin investigations in accordance with any evidence supplied by the complainant. It is necessary to inform you therefore that you may in the coming weeks become the subject of noise monitoring by use of either recording equipment or by officer attendance. The results of such monitoring will be communicated to you as necessary.

Please also note that the licensing division will also be informed of any evidence gathered. If the evidence gathered does indicate that a statutory nuisance is present then a review of your premise licence may be called.

You may re-call that I wrote to you on the 9th January 2009 informing you that a complaint had been received with regards to music emanating from your premises so as to cause disturbance to neighbouring properties owing to its volume at night.

Since that letter was sent to both yourself and Enterprise Inns PLC, Solihull, I have gathered evidence from both diary sheets completed by complainants and additionally I have undertaken noise monitoring within the vicinity of your premises. I wish to provide you with the following evidence.

Answer phone messages were left by a complainant as follows in relation to noise emanating from your premises:

DATE	TIME	INFORMATION
Saturday 7 th March 2009	22:11, 22:23 and 22:25	Music clearly audible in background whilst complainant was describing the noise from the premises.
Saturday 14 th March 2009	22:08 and 23:05	Music clearly audible in background whilst complainant was describing the noise from the premises

As a result of the above information, noise-monitoring equipment was installed, collected and transcribed by myself between the following dates Tuesday 7th and Tuesday 14th April 2009 and Friday 24th and Monday 27th April 2009. (please refer to the enclosed sheets for exact details). Of particular note is the fact that both occasions relate to live bands. Firstly Firegarden billed as playing at The Music Box in the Congleton Chronicle dated 19th March 2009 and secondly, a live band called WKD as advertised on Sean Latham's myspace page http://www.myspace.com/seanwkdguitarist as billed to play on your premises on Saturday 25th April 2009.

Appendix A1

It is my opinion that music, in particular live music / bands playing on your premises are at a volume and duration that amount to a significant disturbance given the dates, times and I believe the problem of noise emanating from your premises is due to the excessive volume of the music / bands, and doors and windows remaining open whilst such events occur.

Therefore it is strongly recommended that you reduce the volume, keep all windows and doors closed during regulated entertainment during licensable activities i.e. when either live bands or amplified music (disco's) are undertaken so that noise does not emanate from your premises so as to cause further disturbance to neighbouring residential properties.

Once again where necessary however, this Division will begin investigations in accordance with any evidence supplied by the complainant. It is necessary to inform you therefore that you may in the coming weeks become the subject of noise monitoring by use of either recording equipment or by officer attendance. The results of such monitoring will be communicated to you as necessary.

Failure to adhere to this advice shall amount to service of a Statutory Nuisance Section 80 Abatement Notice under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 that shall require you to do the same or face prosecution on summary conviction should the notice be breached.





LIVE AND AMPLIFIED MUSIC EMANATING FROM YOUR PREMISES

I write with reference to the continuous investigation into the matter of live music and entertainment noise emanating from your premises so as to cause disturbance to neighbouring properties.

During the evening of Saturday 6th June 2009 I undertook routine surveillance of Congleton and other surrounding towns and villages between the hours of 22:00 (Saturday) and 01:00 (Sunday). At approximately 23:20 I parked my car in Antrobus Street and opposite South Street, I was immediately met with noise from live and amplified music clearly audible above any passing traffic. This location is approximately 70 metres directly from the rear of your premises, although no direct line of sight exists.

I then walked to the top of South street and the noise was becoming louder, clearly audible as a live band. This location is approximately 50 metres directly from the rear of your premises, although no direct line of sight exists.

I then walked around to the end of Holford Street to the closed metal gates leading to the Bulls Head Hotel car park, again the noise was increasing in volume and was a live band. The lead singer was talking to an audience and this was going to be the last song of the evening at around 23:50. This location is approximately 30 metres directly from the rear of your premises, although no direct line of sight exists.

It is most unfortunate that despite a personal visit on the 29th May 2009, repeated letters to both yourself and Enterprise Inns Plc in Solihull requesting that you take such measures so as to prevent the music disturbing neighbouring residential properties (of which I witnessed and also recorded previously using Digital Audio Tape within a nearby residential property), such communication appears to have been in vain.

Therefore, I am satisfied that in accordance with the provisions of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 that a Statutory Noise Nuisance under Section 79(1)(g) exists from your premises and as such an Abatement Notice in respect of Noise Nuisance shall be served upon you as the person responsible for the said nuisance.

Appendix Al

Under the provisions of the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005, Part 7, Chapter 2: General; Noise from premises, paragraph 86, (see below)

86 Deferral of duty to serve abatement notice

In section 80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 (c. 43) (summary proceedings for statutory nuisances), at the beginning of subsection (1) insert "Subject to subsection (2A)" and after subsection (2) insert—

- "(2A) Where a local authority is satisfied that a statutory nuisance falling within paragraph (g) of section 79(1) above exists, or is likely to occur or recur, in the area of the authority, the authority shall—
- (a) serve an abatement notice in respect of the nuisance in accordance with subsections (1) and (2) above; or
- (b) take such other steps as it thinks appropriate for the purpose of persuading the appropriate person to abate the nuisance or prohibit or restrict its occurrence or recurrence.
- (2B) If a local authority has taken steps under subsection (2A)(b) above and either of the conditions in subsection (2C) below is satisfied, the authority shall serve an abatement notice in respect of the nuisance.
- (2C) The conditions are—
- (a) that the authority is satisfied at any time before the end of the relevant period that the steps taken will not be successful in persuading the appropriate person to abate the nuisance or prohibit or restrict its occurrence or recurrence;
- (b) that the authority is satisfied at the end of the relevant period that the nuisance continues to exist, or continues to be likely to occur or recur, in the area of the authority.
- (2D) The relevant period is the period of seven days starting with the day on which the authority was first satisfied that the nuisance existed, or was likely to occur or recur.
- (2E) The appropriate person is the person on whom the authority would otherwise be required under subsection (2A)(a) above to serve an abatement notice in respect of the nuisance."

In accordance with the above, I wish to give you **7 days** from the date of this letter, in which to provide Cheshire East Council with a written scheme of mitigation to attenuate the music / entertainment noise emanating from you premises. It may be appropriate to consult not only with Enterprise Inns PLC, 3 Monkspath Hall Road, Shirley, Solihull, B90 4SJ, but also appoint an Acoustic Engineer who can provide you with the appropriate engineering solution and mitigation measures that you shall require in order to abate the noise nuisance.

However, should you fail to take this opportunity then the above mentioned Abatement Notice shall be served on you as the person responsible and any subsequent breaches of the notice shall be subject to potential prosecution by Cheshire East Council and in addition your Premises Licence LAPRE/1227/05 shall be reviewed by this department in view of the breaches of Condition 4 in Annex 2 namely: Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.

Additionally a copy of this letter has been sent to Enterprise Inns PLC, Solihull and Cheshire East Licensing Department for appropriate action and information.

I write with reference to the continuous investigation into the matter of live music and entertainment noise emanating from your premises so as to cause disturbance to neighbouring residential properties.

Following my letter to you dated Monday 8th June 2009 in which you were requested to forward in **7 days** from the letter, to provide Cheshire East Council with a written scheme of mitigation to attenuate the music / entertainment noise emanating from your premises. It was also suggested that it may be appropriate to consult not only with Enterprise Inns PLC, 3 Monkspath Hall Road, Shirley, Solihull, B90 4SJ as the holder of the premises licence, but also appoint an Acoustic Engineer who can provide you with the appropriate engineering solution and mitigation measures that you might require in order to abate the noise nuisance.

As of Monday 22nd June 2009 this department has not received any such written scheme or indeed have had any contact directly from you. However a letter from Enterprise Inns PLC was received on the 11th June 2009 (see copy enclosed) in relation to this matter.

Therefore, a Section 80 Abatement Notice is now duly served upon you Mr Lee Sean Hulme under the provisions of the Environmental Protection Act 1990.

This notice requires you to immediately prohibit the occurrence and recurrence of a Statutory Nuisance from noise generative entertainment activities. You shall comply with this notice in respect to any noise from your licensable activities as per your Premises Licence LAPRE/1227/05.

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The licensable activities authorised by Premises Licence LAPRE/1227/05 are as follows:

- Supply of alcohol
- Exhibition of a film
- Indoor sporting events

- (4) Where the grounds upon which an appeal is brought include a ground specified in paragraph (2)(h) or (i) above, the appellant shall serve a copy of this notice of appeal on any person referred to, and in the case of any appeal to which this regulation applies he may serve a copy

of his notice of appeal on any other person having an estate or interest in the premises in question.

(5) On the hearing of an appeal the court may-

(a) quash the abatement notice to which the appeal relates, or

(b) vary the abatement notice in favour of the appellant, in such manner as it thinks fit, or

(c) dismiss the appeal;

and an abatement notice that is varied under sub-paragraph (b) above shall be final and shall otherwise have effect, as so varied, as if it had been so made by the local authority.

(6) Subject to paragraph (7) below, on the hearing of appeal the court may make such order as it thinks fit-

(a) with respect to the person by whom any work is to be executed and the contribution to be made by any person towards the cost of the work, or

(b) as to the proportions in which any expenses which may become recoverable by the authority under part III of the 1990 Act are to be borne by the appellant and by any other person.

(7) In exercising its powers under paragraph (6) above, the court-

(a) shall have regard, as between an owner and an occupier, to the terms and conditions, whether contractual or statutory, of any relevant tenancy and to the nature of the works required, and

(b) shall be satisfied, before it imposes any requirement there under on any person other than the appellant, that that person has received a copy of the notice of appeal in pursuance of paragraph (4) above.

SUSPENSION OF NOTICES

3. (1) Where-

(a) an appeal is brought against an abatement notice served under section 80 of the 1990 Act, and-

(b) either-

(i) compliance with the abatement notice would involve any person in expenditure on the carrying out of works before the hearing of the appeal, or

(ii)in the case of a nuisance under section 79(1)(g) of the 1990 Act, the noise to which the abatement notice relates is noise caused in the course of the performance of some duty imposed by law on the appellant, and

(c) either paragraph (2) does not apply, or if it does apply but the requirements of paragraph (3) have not been met, the abatement notice shall be suspended until the appeal has been abandoned or decided by the court.

(2) This paragraph applies where-

(a) the nuisance to which the abatement notice relates-

(i) is injurious to health, or

- (ii)is likely to be of a limited duration such that suspension of the notice would render it of no practical effect, or
- (b) the expenditure which would be incurred by any person in carrying out of works in compliance with the abatement notice before any appeal has been decided would not be disproportionate to the public benefit to be expected in that period from such compliance,

(3) Where paragraph (2) applies the abatement notice-

(a) shall include a statement that paragraph (2) applies, and that as a consequence it shall have effect notwithstanding any appeal to a magistrates' court which has not been decided by the court, and

(b) shall include a statement as to which of the grounds set out in paragraph (2) apply.

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
