### 29 LEISURE MANAGEMENT OPTIONS APPRAISAL – CONSULTANTS' FINAL REPORT

The Sub-Committee considered the final report by the Council's consultants, PMP Genesis Consulting, on the Cheshire East Leisure Management Options Appraisal. The report set out the strategic context for the review, an analysis and evaluation of the options for future management and service delivery, and the consultants' key findings and recommendations. Members noted the recommendation to pursue a new local trust vehicle for the reasons set out in the report.

Since the production of the final report, the Cabinet Member for Health and Wellbeing and other Members of the Cabinet had considered the report conclusions in the light of the budget-setting process. It had been suggested that the implementation of any recommendations should be "put on hold" until a fuller assessment of the implications from the report could be conducted. There was an interest in particular in making connections between leisure services and other strategic interests of the Council, such as library services. In addition, if the Council were successful in securing Building Schools for the Future funding, it would be keen to explore the scope for library services and leisure provision to be appropriately integrated into new developments.

A further benefit of deferring a decision on the recommendation in the Consultants' report would be to allow an evaluation of the Facility Improvement Service which was expected to produce a series of conclusions and a framework for the production of a facilities development strategy in February 2010.

### RESOLVED

That Cabinet be recommended not to proceed at this time with any further work to progress a Trust as the delivery model, and the Consultants' recommendation be placed on hold while further consideration is given to the wider strategic issues and opportunities identified.

### 1.0 Report Summary

- 1.1 This report is in the form of a briefing paper to Members.
- 1.2 The merger in August of the Health and Wellbeing Service with the Adults Service will create a new Directorate known as the Adults, Community Health and Wellbeing Department. As a result, there is a need to review the strategic thinking about the Service and its components individually and as a whole. An approach to this will be illustrated in this report and the Sub-Committee will be asked to shape the strategic direction of this review at the meeting.

### 2.0 Recommendation

2.1 Members consider the context detailed in this report, consider the framework approach detailed in the appendix and shape the strategic direction and approach through dialogue with Officers at the meeting.

### 3.0 Background and Options

- 3.1 The Service has conducted a review of Leisure Services and the Corporate Events Strategy and is undertaking other reviews of its Golf provision and the Lyceum Theatre and Knutsford Cinema. The recommendations from the latter two reviews are likely to be received in late September / early October.
- 3.2 Two important dynamics of any discussion about the future direction and composition of the Service must be framed within the Commissioner/Provider model and the universal-to-targeted continuum (looking to shift more resource towards targeted interventions).
- 3.3 The draft Sustainable Communities Strategy places a specific high prominence on many of the Services and Facilities provided by the Service. The draft Corporate Plan priorities also emphasise the prominent role many of the Services can play in enhancing the quality of life, reducing health inequalities, enhancing the environment and the provision of local services and choice.
- 3.4 The draft Corporate Plan emphasises a number of key priorities which are currently:

- Great local services and choice
- Grow and develop a sustainable area
- Achievement and good health for all
- Enhancing our environment
- Being an excellent Council and working with others
- 3.5 The Health and Wellbeing Service priorities for 2010/2011 are:
  - Increase the numbers participating in activities that can contribute to their learning and/or skills development
  - Contribute to the revitalisation of the communities of Cheshire East through investment in cultural & leisure facilities and green spaces
  - Contribute to the regeneration of our priority communities through increased investment in cultural activity
  - Increase the numbers participating in Health and Wellbeing activities, in particular those from priority communities.
  - Establish a corporate approach to health improvement and reducing health inequalities
  - To achieve improved standards of green space design, management and maintenance.
  - Establish and implement a monitored programme of health and safety measures at Health and Wellbeing sites
  - Increase resident usage and satisfaction with Health and Wellbeing facilities and services.
  - Improve and increase community engagement and involvement
  - Provide services that are equitable and accessible, thereby increasing participation by Cheshire East's diverse communities.
  - Ensure Health and Wellbeing Services meet appropriate national and quality standards, and deliver value for money
  - Contribute to the performance of the Local Strategic partnership through the Health and Wellbeing Thematic sub-group
- 3.6 The Appendix is an illustration of a framework to examine Leisure provision. It draws upon the Facilities Improvement work, the outcomes of the Leisure Options Appraisal and the priorities of draft Corporate Plan.
