Reasons for the Decision and alternatives considered	<p>There is a blue badge holder who lives at No.25 Ryle Street, Macclesfield, who would benefit from the provision of a DPPP in this location. In May 2022, following several months of investigations into eligibility, and identification of funding source, it has now been agreed that a DPPP be introduced outside the property.</p>
