

OPERATING PLAN

J W LEES

1. Prevention of Crime & Disorder

- (i) At J W Lees we recognise the need to encourage responsible drinking by our customers. Accordingly, there shall be no irresponsible drinks promotions at the premises.
- (ii) CCTV shall be installed at the premises and maintained in good working order.
- (iii) All CCTV recordings shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days and images provided to the Police or other Responsible Authorities on request.
- (iv) Staff will be trained in the need to avoid making any sale of alcohol to any person who is drunk.
- (v) A refusals log book will be kept at the premises and will be made available for inspection by a Police Officer or other authorised officer upon request.
- (vi) The need for door security will be assessed by the Premises Licence Holder and/or DPS on a regular basis and SIA registered door staff will be employed when and where the risk assessment deems this appropriate.
- (vii) All staff will be encouraged to monitor all customers entering and leaving the premises. We also encourage vigilance among staff to supervise customers in all parts of the premises.
- (viii) The Premises Licence Holder will adopt a zero tolerance policy towards illegal drugs within the premises.
- (ix) The Designated Premises Supervisor or his/her nominated representative will actively participate in the local Pubwatch scheme.

2. Public Safety

- (i) The premises will undertake regular risk assessments in order to ensure so far as possible the safety of its customers.
- (ii) The premises benefits from Public Liability Insurance.
- (iii) The Premises Licence Holder will consult with the local Fire Authority when appropriate.

- (iv) Fire safety equipment is maintained and certificated in accordance with required standards and intervals.
- (v) The premises will have a first aid box on site.
- (vi) All emergency exits will be unlocked and clear of obstruction at all times.
- (vii) No fire door shall be held open other than by approved devices.

3. The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- (i) The company are mindful of the concerns of residents and will take all reasonable steps to prevent nuisance.
- (ii) Local taxi numbers shall be available for customers to assist in ordering a taxi.
- (iii) Any outside area will be checked regularly to ensure it is clean, tidy and that any empty glasses are removed.
- (iv) Usage of vermin proof bins.
- (v) Refuse will be removed regularly and in a manner sensitive to needs of local residents.
- (vi) There shall be placed at all exits from the premises in a place where they can be seen and easily read by the public, notices requiring patrons to leave the premises and the area quietly.

4. The Protection of Children From Harm

- (i) The premises will operate a "Challenge 21" policy by which any persons who are suspected of being under 21 years of age will be requested to produce evidence of ID. The only acceptable forms of identification will be a passport, photo driving licence and those carrying the PASS logo. Should this not be forthcoming or the ID produced considered unsatisfactory, the sale will be refused.
- (ii) Notices will be displayed in prominent positions at the premises indicating that the Challenge 21 policy is in force.
- (iii) Staff training will include the Challenge/Think 21 Policy and its operation.

- (iv) To keep written records of all training provided in respect to the law relating to underage sales of alcohol. Staff to sign and date records to confirm that training has been received and understood.
- (v) No children under 18 are to enter the premises (except accessing toilet facilities) unless accompanied by an adult.

 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under this Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

1. There shall be lighting in the car park of the premises.

Public Safety

- 2. There shall be fire extinguishers at the premises.
- 3. The premises shall have a smoking charter.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 4. Customer departure from the premises shall be managed.
- 5. The windows at the premises shall be lockable/closed windows.

Protection of Children from Harm

6. There shall be no unaccompanied children in the premises.

General – All Licensing Objectives

- 7. There shall be a 30 minute drinking up time will allow appropriate dispersal, use of lavatories etc.
- 8. Where there is provided in the Premises an entertainment for children, or an entertainment at which the majority of the persons attending are children, then, if the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds one hundred, it shall be the duty of the person providing the entertainment to station and keep stationed wherever necessary a sufficient number of adult attendants, properly instructed as to their duties, to prevent more children or other persons being admitted to the building, or to any part thereof, than the building or part can properly accommodate, and to control the movement of the children and other persons admitted while entering and leaving the building or any part thereof, and to take all other reasonable precautions for the safety of the children
- 9. Where the occupier of the Premises permits, for hire or reward, the Premises to be used for the purpose of an entertainment, he shall take all reasonable steps to secure the observance of the provisions of condition 8 above.

APPENDIX 06

- 10. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:
- (1) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- (2) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- (3) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- (4) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

1. Live music must not be audible from any residential premises (noise sensitive point) after 23.00.
