Why Control Street Trading

 Gives powers to control numbers and quality of Street Trading

- To add vitality and choice to town centres
- Regeneration / Economic
 Development

Designating Streets

To be able to control street trading:

- Adoption of Legislation
- Designation of Streets

A Public Notice of intention to pass a resolution placed in a local newspaper
Copy to the Police and the Highway Authority



Designating Streets

- 28 days must elapse to allow for objections
- Pass a resolution confirming designations
- Further Public Notice to be published for two consecutive weeks in local newspaper
- First of these public notices must be published within 28 days of the date of the resolution



Definitions

- Prohibited Street a street in which street trading is prohibited
- Consent Street a street in which street trading is prohibited without the consent of the Council
- Licensed Street a street in which street trading is prohibited without a Licence issued by the Council



What is a Street?

Street includes—

- (a) any road, footway, beach or other area to which the public have access without payment; and
- (b) a service area as defined in section 329 of the Highways Act 1980

What is Trading?

The selling or exposing or offering for sale of any article (including a living thing) in a street



Exemptions

- Trading as a Pedlar (Licensed by the Police under the Pedlars Act 1871)
- Markets or fairs established by Charter or other Legislation
- Trunk Road picnic areas provided under S.112 Highways Act 1980



Exemptions

- Trading as a news vendor
- Trading as either a petrol station or as an area in a street adjoining a shop and used as part of the shop
- Selling, offering or exposing things as a Roundsman





- Use for trading under Highways Act 1980 of an object or structure placed on or over highway
- Operation of facilities under the Highways Act for refreshment or recreation
- Doing of anything authorised by Regs made under the Police Factories Act 1916



Fees

- The Council may charge such fees as they consider reasonable for the grant or renewal of a consent/licence (S. 9 (1))
- Different fees for different types of licence/consent (S. 9 (2))



Offences

- Engages in street trading in a prohibited street
- Engages in street trading in a consent street without being authorised
- Making a false statement



Enforcement

- Due diligence to avoid commission of the offence
- A person guilty of an offence shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale.
