- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises licence:
 - At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises licence, or
 - At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal licence, or his/her Personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal licence.

LICENSING ACT 2003 (MANDATORY LICENSING CONDITIONS) ORDER 2010 MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Condition 1

- (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

Condition 2

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

Condition 3

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Condition 4

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Condition 5

The responsible person shall ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with Operating Schedule

- 1. Proof of age scheme in operation.
- 2. No irresponsible sales promotions or discounted prices of alcoholic Beverages shall be offered to customers
- 3. No noise or vibration will emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 4. Prominent and clear notices will be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 5. No-one under the age of 18 will be allowed to enter or remain on the premises unless accompanied by an adult.
- 6. Licensable activities permitted at the premises are as follows:-

20:00 - 23:30 (Mon - Sun)

SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

7. The hours for the sale of alcohol are extended throughout the period between New Years Eve and the commencement of normal licensing hours on New Years Day.

The hours for regulated entertainment are extended to 00:30 on New Years Eve and from 12:00 to 23:30 on Good Friday, Easter Saturday and Easter Sunday.



Objection to above application for variation

I am objecting about potential public nuisance, potential crime and disorder and a risk to public safety.

My name is I am the owner of the four storey building at Hospital Street Nantwich direct next door (no gap) to the applicants two storey premises at The Vine Inn 42 Hospital Street.

Hospital street consists of two separately let flats second and third floor and commercial offices on the ground floor.

The Vine Pub is situated in the middle of a residential area on Hospital street with a 6 bed house opposite, 4 flats across Hospital Street and 2 flats next door. Consideration needs to be given to all these residents and family (there are young children) and there right to a reasonable peace and quality of life without unnecessary disruption.

As owner of the building I have lived on the second floor and third floor flats and have experienced late night music at the Vine on occasions. In my experience it prevents local residents from enjoying not only normal sleep but also normal indoor leisurely activities such as watching television. With any extension in hours this problem will become even more unreasonable in a residential area denying residents a quality of life most weekdays and at weekends into the early hour of the following day.

The building around are all to my knowledge grade listed buildings with poor insulation, no double glazing and thin walls. The street itself is narrow with tall building, any sound does reverberates around the buildings in the street.

The front door step to my building has often been littered with cigarette butts, beer bottles and glasses from the pub next door which I judge to be a public nuisance. I accept that if you live next door to a pub this may happen but undoubtedly these issues would grow if the variation is allowed without condition.

The bedroom of the flat on the first floor is situated at the front of the building and therefore subject to normal noise pollution from the street. With more opening hours comes more music comes more people on the street and the inevitable more noise and lower quality of life for the residents.

I'm not unreasonable person and understand a pubs desire to extend there trade. But is it reasonable to impose this nuisance at the cost of the local public's quality of life.

I would like to suggest the following conditions that will help and go so way to a reasonable compromise.

Entertainment as proposed ends at the reasonable time 11.30pm

Entertainment as proposed is only indoors ie not in beer garden

Proposed variations to entertainment and hours do not apply on Sunday and Monday's

All windows and doors remain closed during music (obviously people have to exit etc) - the sound travels

CCTV is installed on the street side to discourage public nuisance

Authorised doormen/security operate from 2 hours before closing time to ensure a reduced risk of public disorder on the street side

Given the location of the applicant and it proximity to residential homes then I think these conditions are in keeping with the area should go some way to safeguard the public.

Response to the Police suggestions

1. A CCTV system will be installed at the premises to the satisfaction of the Police Licensing Officer. It must record at all times the premises are open to the public. Unedited images must be securely retained for at least 28 days and copies made freely available upon request to a constable or an employee of the Police Authority or Local Authority.

Response or questions - will the cameras be located on the exterior of the building ie street front door area, in addition to internal?

2. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that a comprehensive risk assessment is conducted, at intervals of not more than 31 days, into the need for door supervisors to be on duty at the premises. This risk assessment will be recorded in writing, produced to a constable and authorised officers of the local authority on request, and a copy retained at the premises for a period of at least 6 months from the date of the assessment.

Response or questions - Given the location of the pub is in a predominately residential area we'd suggest that door supervisors be placed on the premises for six months beginning from the granting of licence with a comprehensive risk assessment thereafter to assess the need or otherwise. The said risk assessment be shared with the local residence (a defined group) via email. To include a section for the residents to make a record of events that occur, emanating from the pub, and effecting there quality of life.

Surely it is reasonable to try and maintain the current peaceful environment by installing door supervisor, without supervisors the local residents will suffer a deteriorating situation with little or no recourse. As they did not ask for this change the pub should do everything possible to reduce the risk of public nuisance.

The Police suggested approach the pub is playing 'game keeper and poacher' and may only have a financial incentive to record only a favourable situation. Without a proactive and involved approach many residents may well suffer sleepless disturbed nights without being able influence or change the situation.

Proposed variation of hours The Vine Inn Public House, Hospital Street, Nantwich

OBJECTION

My Name is I am a tenant at Hospital Street, Nantwich and have been resident at the property for the last 5 years. The property is adjacent to The Vine Inn.

I wish to object to the application currently lodged with yourselves by The Vine Inn regarding the variation in opening hours and the hours in which alcohol may be served and entertainment provided.

My objection is on the following grounds:

- 1. That the variation of hours will result in an increase in public nuisance
- 2. That the variation of hours will result in an increase of crime and public disorder.

I support my objection with the following comments.

The living room and bedroom of my flat is situated at the front of the building and therefore has it's share of normal noise from the street both day and night. They are a matter of feet from the front door on The Vine. Although noise can be a problem on Friday and Saturday evenings, the noise from The Vine and the area outside is, by and large, at a tolerable level. This is due in no small part to the present nature of the pub and its patrons. It has the reputation of a 'drinkers pub' and does not seem to attract the 'noisy' element.

However I am extremely concerned that the proposed extended hours together with accompanying entertainment and live music will attract an altogether different clientèle.

More opening hours and more music will, in my opinion, inevitably entice more people to The Vine, especially if the plans for an internal refurbishment go ahead. More people inside will naturally lead to more people congregating outside; especially on warm summer evenings when the pub's front door is likely to be left open. On occasions when there has been live music staged in the pub, the noise levels are much greater and increase dramatically when the front door is open.

I'm understand the current owners desire to extend their trade and applaud their efforts to want to smarten the pub up. However I do not think that the sought after increase in business should be at the expense of the peace and quiet of local residents; especially in the early hours of the morning. The requested variation in hours can only have a detrimental impact on my quality of my life and the lives of my fellow residents.

The noise problem has an attendant issue, that of crime and public disorder. It is wholly conceivable that the attraction of later opening hours will bring with it an increased risk of public disorder in the immediate environs of the pub. It is inevitable that issues with litter and petty vandalism will increase.

I ask that the Council acknowledge that fact that The Vine shares Hospital Street with a number of residential properties and rejects the application on the grounds mentioned above.

As a family we reside directly opposite The Vine at and often have to deal with their customers loud and raucous behaviour, particularly when they flaunt their legal opening times and often run late night 'lock-ins'. This is a residential street that needs no more rowdiness than exists today. The Vine also run live music which often extends past 11pm which is loud enough to be heard in our bedroom and wakes our children.

In Nantwich there are ample late night pubs and bars that stay open late and we don't need another one, particularly not in a residential area.

I find the request quite unbelievable. When the Vine attracts the older, local clientele it can be a quiet pub but extending the opening hours will attract the idiots that think its ok to shout and run riot on Hospital Street. You only have to walk down the street on a Sunday morning to see the smashed windows on the small local shops and if we encourage more late night drinking and stupidity on hospital street we will drive out these small businesses that make Nantwich so unique.

Finally, we have called the authorities on a number of occasions in any given year with regard the high level of noise pollution. This application will only make the issue worse.
