Dear Sir,

I am writing to express my objection to the Ox-fford Public House being granted a seven day entertainment licence. The reasons for this objection are set out below taking into consideration the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance.

The Ox-fford pub is located in a primarily residential setting, if these premises are granted a licence to provide entertainment in whatever form 7 days a week, excessive noise is inevitable.

Parking is already extremely difficult on Beswick Street for residents the additional pressure due to entertainment at the pub which does not have parking provision will lead to increased difficulties for local residents.

Currently the patrons leave the above mentioned public house at all hours of the night, many excessively intoxicated. Shouting and fighting have occurred on the road outside our home into the early hours, this is bad enough over the weekend but it is totally unacceptable during the week.

Both my partner and I have to get up early in the morning due to the nature of our jobs and we do not want to be disturbed from the noise created by people leaving the pub in the early hours.

In all I strongly believe that granting a 7 day entertainment licence to The Ox-fford premises will cause a public nuisance and excessive noise in a generally quiet residential area of Macclesfield.





I understand that the Ox-Fford Public House on Oxford Road has recently applied for a 7-day music licence to allow live music to be played on the premises 7 days a week.


As a resident living I wish to strongly object to the potential issuing of this licence. The area surrounding the pub is solely a residential area. Allowing live music 7-days a week will have an extremely detrimental effect on residents' quality of life. If there are any families living nearby with young children this will affect their sleep patterns and therefore the children's development and general welfare. I believe the current landlords of the Ox-Fford themselves have small children so I would also question the effects this would have on their own childrens' welfare.

There is also already a problem with cars parking directly on the pavements surrounding the pub which constitutes illegal parking, the music licence may well increase the number of cars parking illegally in the area.

the pub garden, I feel strongly that if the pub is allowed to hold live music events any day of the week, this will cause increased noise pollution in a residential area and in turn cause myself and other residents great distress.

I hope that my objections and objections from other residents will be taken into consideration when deciding what benefits there would be to the local community if a licence is issued to the Ox-Fford pub.

#### Dear Mrs Cadman

I do object to the granting of the variation - the one sought bu the pub and the proposed compromise.

- 1 This is a residential area many houses locally with small children and most of us with jobs we do not need to have our lives disrupted by late night drinking and music and the associated noise outside the pub. When people come out the noise wakes us up on a very regular basis. Drunken people shouting and screaming.
- 2 Parking here is simply hell during the evenings. The pub has no parking and cars clog up the streets. I would never dare to leave my car parked at the front of the house due to the likely damage from the people leaving the pub.
- 3 I have called the police and reported the pub to the council once. It could have been 6 or 7 times more. It happens at least once per fortnight.
- 4 I have called the police myself twice in the last few months due to trouble caused by the pub. I have also been into the council to complain and spoken to environmental health due to the noise. Please check your records. The noise that led to my first complaint was tremendous blaring out until after midnight sometimes it has continued until 1am.

  I understand that at that time the pub had already been warned about the noise/open windows etc but it is obvious that they ignored this. You will see that on the date of my visit to the council I was also reporting the damage caused to the large flowerbed by the drunken youths coming out of the pub at about midnight. They rolled around and destroyed the flowerbed and could not even stand up they were so drunk. They were noisy vandals and should have been refused further alcohol many drinks earlier. They left after half an hour of crawling around and damaging property, in a taxi. I reported the taxi number to the police but I dont know if any action was taken. The flowerbed was ruined for the next 2 months.
- 5 On the 25/9 the pub had a party with live music it is usually Karaoke which causes the noise... When the karaoke stopped at approximately 11.30pm and for an hour or so we were treated to the spectacle of approximately 50 youths staggering about screaming, sitting on our doorstep trying to vomit, ripping our neighbour's cable tv box off the wall and, again, crawling around so drunk they could not even stand up. I work with Children and Young People and many of these youths appeared to be underage. It is also an offence to serve alcohol to someone who is intoxicated.

6 The proposed compromise will not work - I have no objections to the 11pm Friday and Saturday, but not mid week. The parking issues and the noise as people leave the pub will be the same midweek. They also do not learn from warnings - there were 3 incidents in the 3 weeks following my visit to the council and the warnings which the man from Environmental Health said he and the police would make. The problems still continue.

In summary, the pub as it is at present is a problem on some nights - with longer hours I believe this will simply be much worse. If they want a pub with this level of noise they should seek a pub which is not in the middle of a residential area. The Ox-Fford was always a good local pub but has over the last year deteriorated into a noisy, offensive neighbour - with disrupted sleep, damage to property and a very bad reputation locally. I complained about the pub before this licence application and am staggered that the local authority are considering granting it with the level of local opposition and the number of complaints.

This cut-off point does not seem to me to be either relevant or reasonable. The Oxford pub is set directly amongst lives of ferraced houses with no grounds of its own. The noise directly affects the summanding homes.

#### RE: The Oxfford Pub (Oxford Road, Macclesfield) Extended Music License Application

I am writing to state my objection to the current extended music license application made by the Oxfford Pub.

I have lived on Beswick Street (and the Oxfford Pub) for 6 years and during this time I have been witness to customers of the pub fighting, shouting, swearing, vomiting, urinating and revving car/bike engines outside my house. These events often occur in the small hours of the morning and the noise is made worse by the particular acoustics of this area, in that any noise is amplified off the surrounding houses. Due to the smoking ban customers often congregate in large groups in the street outside of my house and even when the yard of The Oxfford is used for smoking purposes the noise is again amplified by the surrounding walls of the yard and can be heard very clearly by the large number of residents in the area from within our houses.

Although I understand that The Oxfford is a licensed pub it is also situated in a highly residential area whose occupants are wholly effected by the behaviour of some of the pubs customers. Macclesfield has a large number of town centre entertainment establishments which I suggest are better positioned for late night music entertainment and where any trouble may also be easily policed. In the past I have also witnessed fights that have spilled into the path of oncoming cars on Oxfford Road.

In past years The Oxfford pub has been a respectable local pub where people can enjoy a drink and in this context I have no objection to the pubs license. However I believe the extension of the existing license will have a detrimental effect on the local area by increasing the amount of antisocial behaviour that myself and my neighbours are continuously subject to, and in turn will have a further negative effect on the local community.

The reasons for our objection are as follows

- 1. The Oxx Ford is situated in a residential area and has absolutely no parking facilities of its own what so ever. As it is the parking in the Oxford Road and Beswick Street area is extremely limited due to double yellow lines on one side of Beswick Street. Residents currently find it difficult to park as it is without any more vehicles trying to park. Also vehicles can only park on one side of Oxford Road which causes additional parking problems as residents from both sides of the road have to use one side of the road.
- 2. The noise levels from the proposed late night 7 days a week live music and dancing would be totally unacceptable in a residential area. Noise levels would make sleep difficult and also would probably affect the values of property in close proximity to the public house.





- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this Premises Licence -
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under this Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.

#### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

#### **Prevention of Crime and Disorder**

#### **Public Safety**

- 1. Fire exits shall be clearly signed and lit
- 2. Fire fighting equipment and emergency lighting will be checked regularly.

#### **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

3. There shall be a notice asking the patrons to leave quietly.

#### Protection of Children from Harm

- 4. Children accompanied by an adult will only allowed in the beer garden and no smoking dart room.
- 5. Children will not be allowed in the vicinity of the AWP machine.
- 6. There shall be a proof of age scheme in place, all staff will be trained to observe and carry out this practice.

#### General – All Licensing Objectives

- 7. Where there is provided in the Premises an entertainment for children, or an entertainment at which the majority of the persons attending are children, then, if the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds one hundred, it shall be the duty of the person providing the entertainment to station and keep stationed wherever necessary a sufficient number of adult attendants, properly instructed as to their duties, to prevent more children or other persons being admitted to the building, or to any part thereof, than the building or part can properly accommodate, and to control the movement of the children and other persons admitted while entering and leaving the building or any part thereof, and to take all other reasonable precautions for the safety of the children
- 8. Where the occupier of the Premises permits, for hire or reward, the Premises to be used for the purpose of an entertainment, he shall take all reasonable steps to secure the observance of the provisions of condition 7 above.
- 9. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- (1) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- (2) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- (3) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- (4) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.
