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Please provide an update on indicative progress against the metric?	No improvement in performance
Commentary on progress:	There has been a slight reduction in the number of NEL for Q4 10,917 compared to 10,985 for Q3. However this does not reflect an improvement in performance.

Delayed Transfers of Care	Delayed Transfers of Care (delayed days) from hospital per 100,000 population (aged 18+)
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Please provide an update on indicative progress against the metric?	No improvement in performance
Commentary on progress:	Q4 returns reflect the continued pressures within Cheshire East. Sustained work continues to support teams and also across the redesign of services locally.

Local performance metric as described in your approved BCF plan	Injuries due to falls, persons 65+
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Please provide an update on indicative progress against the metric?	On track for improved performance, but not to meet full target
Commentary on progress:	The Q4 results shows a reduction in the number of injuries due to falls which demonstrates improved performance overall.

Please provide an update on indicative progress against the metric?	On track for improved performance, but not to meet full target
Commentary on progress:	Final results at Q4 show that there has been consistent improvement throughout the year, with the final result being 64.5% compared with the target of 65%.

Admissions to residential care	Rate of permanent admissions to residential care per 100,000 population (65+)

Please provide an update on indicative progress against the metric?	No improvement in performance
Commentary on progress:	Q4 has seen a significant increase to residential care. This means that the end of year position shows that there is no improvement in performance during 2016/17.

Reablement	Proportion of older people (65 and over) who were still at home 91 days after discharge from hospital into reablement / rehabilitation services
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Please provide an update on indicative progress against the metric?	No improvement in performance
Commentary on progress:	Q4 has seen a very slight decrease in the number of people who are still at home after 91 days, however the year end position shows overall no improvement in performance. *NB* This is an early provisional figure. Data is still to be verified and validated as part of end of year returns to NHS Digital.
