This representation is made in reference to the application for a premises license made by Charles Roundell of Dorfold Hall Acton under the Licensing Act 2003 (current license Premises 1065).

I am objecting to the grant of the license under the terms applied for because of the following reasons:

- 1. Dorfold Hall is primarily used as a wedding venue. Since that business commenced wedding parties have been arranged largely outside the main building. I myself and other neighbours have previously complained to Cheshire East about late night noise generated, often until well past 1 am, which has been intrusive and a disturbance of peace in the area.
- 2. I am assuming Dorfold Hall will now be operating its business from inside the Hall and it will no longer be operated externally. However the application to extend the serving of alcohol to non residents until 2 am in the morning totally ignores the rights and entitlement of neighbours to reside peacefully and without intrusive disturbance. Allowing a 2 am close for alcohol means that non resident attendees are likely to be leaving the venue between 2 am 3:30 am in the morning who will no doubt be suitably boisterous. Extending to 2 am is therefore totally unacceptable.
- 3. I would have no objection to a sensible restriction for the sale of alcohol to say 12:30 am but no later. I would also expect Mr Roundell to provide confirmation that noise levels will be monitored and controlled, including loud disco music etc.
- 4. Following historic complaints from neighbours about fireworks being set off at various times of the night that appears to have ceased. It is important that this element of the business is not resurrected.
