It has been brought to my attention that Wilmslow Rugby Club has applied for a new premises licence. Some of their plans for the future have been circulated by members and friends and as a resident of [REDACTED], my home is situated [REDACTED] from the club grounds, the thought of this application succeeding fills me with horror.

I already have to regularly pick up empty beer cans, bottles and ever occasionally glasses from my hedge on [REDACTED]. The club already hosts several events throughout the year including their rugby festival, running festival, Wilmslow half marathon, etc as well as allowing their site to be used as a base for television companies, who happen to be filming in the area. It has been used by the Caravan Club as its site for its New Year party gathering which has meant numerous caravans driving up and down Kings Road. The club is now also the site for a fitness centre which means increased traffic and noise quite early in the morning. It also hires out its premises for private functions which has meant loud noise with car doors banging ,engines revving etc causing excessive noise late into the night.

This area has recently been changed to 20mph area because of speeding traffic and constraints have been installed in the surrounding streets to limit this traffic. These new plans will welcome the arrival of several thousand people by car and taxi. The existing car park at the club cannot cater for the expected number of guests and the resultant overspill will be spread over the surrounding streets. The road verges and road surfaces are already in a mess due to large beer trucks, team coaches etc turning into the narrow entrance to the club.

I have always sought to support the club in its existing activities and have not objected, although I have had to complain to the police in the past about the dangerous parking outside my home at [REDACTED]. However, the thought of beer festivals , large parties, outdoor concerts, increased delivery lorries, portable toilets, sound systems, lighting and stage trucks together with thousands of guests and their private cars and taxis and issues with parking, litter, noise etc mean that on this issue

I MUST OBJECT TO THE PREMISES LICENCE APPLICATION IN ITS ENTIRETY .

The Memorial Ground exists as a rugby ground in a residential area and this should be its raison d'etre, it was never designed to be a festival or concert park.
