Procedure for Hearings – Licensing Act 2003

The Licensing Committee

The full Licensing Committee consists of fifteen elected Members of the Council. From this full Committee will be drawn sub-committees of three members to deal with licensing functions under the Licensing Act 2003. The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Licensing Committee shall have the discretion to refer a matter up to a hearing of the full Licensing Committee.

Officers at Hearings

- The Committee Officer introduces all parties and records the proceedings
- The Legal Adviser provides independent advice to the Members on legal matters and procedure.
- The Licensing Officer will introduce the matter and outline the application; the officer will also answer any questions Members may have.

PROCEDURE

NOTE: If the Sub-Committee has not already elected a Chairman, that will be the first item of business.

1	Chairman	The Chairman will: (i) call the matter to be considered (ii) call for any declarations of interest (iii) ask all parties to introduce themselves (iv) summarise the procedure to be followed at the hearing (v) will consider any request made by a party for another person to appear at the hearing (v) will advise the parties of any maximum period of time in which it has to present its case (if a maximum is imposed this shall be equal for all parties)	
2	Licensing Officer	Will introduce and summarise the application, highlighting areas of contention or dispute.	
3	Committee Members	May ask questions of the Licensing Officer	
4	Applicant	Will present his/her case, calling witnesses, as appropriate. (If necessary, applicant will produce any notices required by law. Legal Adviser will draw attention to this if required.)	

5	Responsible Authorities (who have made representations)	Each in turn may ask <u>questions</u> of the applicant, by way of clarification.	
6	Other Persons (who have made representations)	To be invited to ask <u>questions</u> of the applicant, by way of clarification. It is normal practice for a spokesperson only to speak on behalf of a group of residents.	
7	Committee Members	Each in turn may ask <u>questions</u> of the applicant.	
8	Applicant	May make a <u>statement</u> or ask his witnesses to clarify any matters which he feels are unclear, or may have been misunderstood.	
9	Responsible Authorities	Will make their representations.	
10	Applicant	Or his representative or witnesses to ask <u>questions</u> of Responsible Authorities represented at the meeting, by way of clarification.	
11	Other Persons (who have made representations)	May ask <u>questions</u> of the Responsible Authorities represented at the meeting, by way of clarification. (Note: This is not the point at which they should be stating their objections.)	
12	Committee Members	May ask <u>questions</u> of the Responsible Authorities represented at the meeting	
13	Other Persons (who have made representations)	Those who have objected to the application will be invited <u>to</u> <u>make observations on the application</u> and present the bases of their objections.	
15	Applicant	Or his representative or witnesses may ask <u>questions</u> of the other persons, by way of clarification.	
16	Committee Members	May ask <u>questions</u> of the other persons.	
17	Chairman	To invite both Responsible Authorities and Other Persons to make their closing addresses.	

18	Applicant	Or his representative will <u>briefly summarise the application</u> and comment on the observations and any suggested conditions.	
19	Committee	Will retire to consider the application. The Committee may request the Legal Advisor to advise on legal issues.	
20	Committee	Will return to give its decision, with reasons, which will be announced by the Chairman and subsequently confirmed in writing to the applicant and to all the parties that made representations. In cases where a decision cannot be given at the end of the hearing, parties will be advised of the decision within five	

Notes

- The hearing shall normally be held in public. There may be occasions on which the Committee find it necessary to exclude members of the press and public; any such decision will be taken on the basis that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing taking place in public.
- 2. The Chairman may require any person behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or (b) permit him/her to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify, but any such person may submit in writing any information which they would have been entitled to provide orally if they had not been required to leave.
- 3. Prior to the hearing each party shall have given notification and served documentation (eg statements of witnesses or reports of experts) as required. Late representations and evidence will only be considered with the agreement of all parties.
- 4. Anyone entitled to be heard may be represented by any person, whether or not that person is legally qualified.
- 5. Hearsay will be permitted but the Sub-Committee will be reminded to give it appropriate weight.
- 6. Due note shall be taken of the provisions of the Hearings Regulations 2005.
- 7. The Chair may, in the interests of expediency or convenience of the parties, vary the procedure from time to time, provided notice is given to the parties and the rules of natural justice are observed.

Summary of Procedure

- 1. Chairman appointed (if this has not been done previously).
- 2. Chairman to call for declarations of interest and request that all parties introduce themselves.
- 3. Chairman summarises the procedure for the hearing
- 4. The Licensing Officer summarises the application
- 5. Applicant to present his/her case.
- 6. Applicant to be questioned by all parties (to clarify points only) following which, he/she can clarify any other matters which he/she feels may have been misunderstood when the application was presented.
- 7. Applicant to be questioned by the Committee.
- 8. Responsible Authorities to make their representations following which they can be questioned by all parties by way of clarification.
- 9. Other Persons will be invited to present the bases of their objections, following which they can be questioned by all parties by way of clarification.
- 10. The applicant will be invited to sum up his/her case
- 11. Committee/Sub-Committee withdraws to make its decision
- 12. Committee/Sub-Committee returns to announce its decision to all present.

Purpose of Report

To allow Members of the Sub-Committee to determine a contested application to a variation of a premises licence application made under the Licensing Act 2003 for the following premises:

CUBAR, High Street, Sandbach, CW11 1AL

Executive Summary

The report provides details of a variation application for a Premises Licence, under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003, sets out the relevant representations made, and outlines the evidence presented by the parties in relation to the application.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Licensing Act Sub-Committee is requested to consider the application and any relevant representations and determine what steps, if any, it considers are appropriate to promote the Licensing Objectives.

Background

On 14th May 2024 an application was received by the Licensing Department to vary a premises licence in respect of a premises known as CUBAR, High Street, Sandbach, Cheshire CW1 1AL. The application was sent for consultation on the same day (14th May 2024). The last date for representations to be made was 11th June 2024. A copy of the application form and plan is attached as **Appendix 1** to this report.

- 4 Licensing records show that a Premises Licence currently exists in relation to CUBAR, 45 High Street, Sandbach. A copy of Premises Licence Number 1541 is attached to this report at **Appendix 2**
- The operating schedule indicates that the relevant licensable activities that will be subject to change if this application is successful are the provision of live and recorded music.

The amended hours applied for are as follows:

Provision of Recorded Music (indoors and out)

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 01.00

Christmas Eve and New Years Eve 12.00 – 02.00 hours

The applicant has stated the music will be played as background music via a Sonos 1 mini currently located on the rear of the building – ambience only.

- A premises licence was originally granted for the premises on 18th July 2014 under the name The Folks Bar. The licence was transferred to Cubar Sandbach Limited on 6th September 2019. Cubar Sandbach Limited went into liquidation on 12th October 2023 and due to administration error, the premises licence was not transferred to the new company name of Cubar Cheshire. Consequently, the premises licence lapsed, a new licence was applied for and was granted on 26th December 2023.
- A map of the area in which the premises is located is attached to this report at **Appendix 3.**

Consultation and Engagement

- Licensing records show that the Public Notice that is required to be displayed at or near the proposed premises in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Premises licences and club premises certificates) Regulations 2005. The notice was inspected by a Licensing Officer on 21st May 2024 and confirmed to be present and met the requirements under the regulations. The Public Notice has also been duly advertised in the Sandbach Chronicle on 16th May 2024.
- 9 Responsible Authorities:

Environmental Health have agreed conditions with the applicant. A copy of the agreed conditions are attached to this report Appendix 4.

Other Persons:

The Licensing Authority has received three representations from members of the public. A copy of the representations are attached to this report at **Appendix 5.**

Reasons for Recommendations

- 11 The Licensing Act Sub-Committee has the power to determine this application in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's Constitution.
- Acting in the capacity of the Licensing Authority, Members must seek to promote the Licensing Objectives and where Members consider that matters have engaged one or more of the Objectives, they may exercise their discretion. The Licensing Objectives are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The prevention of public nuisance
 - The protection of children from harm

Other Options Considered

No other options have been considered because the process for determining contested applications is set by legislation.

Implications and Comments

Monitoring Officer/Legal

- 14 The Sub Committee must determine this application in accordance with section 35 of the Licensing Act 2003. To do so otherwise would render its determination unlawful and invalid.
- In accordance with the provisions of section 35 (3)(b) of the Licensing Act 2003 the Licensing Authority Sub Committee must, having regard to the representations, made in this application take such steps (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 16 Section 35 (4) provides that the authority may:
 - Modify the conditions of the licence
 - Reject the whole or part of the application

- 17 Members are reminded that should any conditions be added or amended, they should be practical, enforceable and appropriate to promote the Licensing Objectives.
- 18 Members may not extend the period for which the licence has effect.
- 19 Members may not vary substantially the premises to which the licence relates.
- 20 Members are reminded that they are to determine the variation application before them and cannot change parts of the licence that are not part of the application.
- 21 Members are also reminded of the statutory obligation placed on the Local Authority under section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 to through all of its various functions, and Licensing is one of those functions to do all that it can to prevent Crime and disorder, Anti-social Behaviour, behaviour adversely affecting the environment and reoffending.
- Members of the Licensing Sub-Committee are reminded that they may not exercise discretion in any case, merely because it considers it desirable to do so. Careful consideration should be given to the application and the evidence presented by the parties in relation to the application.
- Members must give reasons for their determination and notice of it must be communicated to the parties to this application. If Members depart from the Statutory Guidance or the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy then their decision notice must set out the reasons for doing so.
- 24 Finally, Members are also reminded that in determining the application, consideration also needs to be given to:
 - The rules of natural justice
 - The provisions of the Human Rights Act 1998



Mandatory condition where the licence authorises the exhibition of films

The admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003. Admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the British Board of Film Classification or the Licensing Authority.

 - i. Drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii. Drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b) Provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c) Provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period for 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d) Selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner:
- e) Dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Condition 2

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Condition 3

- 1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 2. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- 3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - a) A holographic mark, or
 - b) An ultraviolet feature

Condition 4

The responsible person must ensure that –

a) Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

i. Beer or cider: ½ pint;

ii. Gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and

iii. Still wine in a glass: 125ml;

- b) These measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c) Where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2014

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - a) 'duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - b) 'permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where —

i. P is the permitted price,

ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- c) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - i. the holder of the premises licence,
 - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - iii. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

- e) 'valued added tax' means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that subparagraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

General

We shall ensure when the premises are open for any licensable activity, there are sufficient competent staff on duty at the premises for the purpose of fulfilling the terms and conditions of the licence and for preventing crime and disorder. We shall ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities in relation to the sale of alcohol, particularly with regard to drunkenness and underage persons. Records will be kept of training and refresher training. We will operate a prove your age policy which will be displayed and challenged.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Any incidents of a criminal nature that may occur on the premises will be reported to the Police. We have comprehensive CCTV coverage at the premises and it is operated and maintained at the premises. The CCTV system shall conform to the following points:

- 1. Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors both inside and outside.
- 2. Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.
- 3. Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of screen.
- 4. Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises.
- 5. Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed.
- 6. Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image.
- 7. Provide good quality images -colour during opening times.
- 8. Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises.
- 9. Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet.
- 10. Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality.
- 11. Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture retention.
- 12. Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation.
- 13. Digital images must be kept for 31 days.
- 14. Police will have access to images at any reasonable time.
- 15. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e. G. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy, if this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.

Public Safety

Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (foam, H20 and CO2), fire blanket, internally illuminated fire exit signs, numerous smoke detectors and emergency lighting All appliances are inspected and tested twice per year under a service contract.

All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

All customers will be asked to leave quietly. We will operate a daily start of shift to inspect not just our premises but for any rubbish / etc and always ensure we keep a clean tidy environment fitting with our surroundings

Protection of Children from Harm

The staff will ask persons who appear to be under the age of 25 for photographic ID such as proof of age cards, driving licence or passport, an official identity card issued by HM Forces or by an EU country, bearing the photograph and date of birth of bearer. All staff will be trained for UNDERAGE SALES PREVENTION regularly.

Licensing Act 2003 - Premises Licence

Duration of a Premises Licence

A premises licence has effect until such a time that it is suspended, revoked or surrendered.

Duty to notify change of name or address

The holder of a premises licence must, as soon as is reasonably practicable, notify the relevant licensing authority of any change of name or address.

Where the designated premises supervisor (DPS) under a premises licence is not the holder of the licence, he should notify the licensing authority of a change in name or address as soon as possible. The DPS must also notify the holder of the premises licence.

Failure without reasonable excuse to comply with the above is an offence, and a person will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale (ie£500)

Duty to keep and display licence

The holder of a premises licence must ensure that the licence or a certified copy of it is kept at the premises in the custody of or under the control of the holder of the licence or a person who works at the premises whom the premises licence holder has nominated in writing. A notice should be prominently displayed at the premises specifying the position of any such nominee.

The premises licence holder has a duty to ensure that a summary of the licence or a certified copy of that summary is prominently displayed at the premises.

Failure without reasonable excuse to comply with the above is an offence, and a person will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale (ie £500)

Duty to produce licence

A constable or an authorised person may require production of the premises licence for examination. An authorised person must, if requested, produce evidence of his authority to exercise the power.

Failure without reasonable excuse to comply with the above is an offence, and a person will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale (ie £500)

Theft or loss of premises licence

Where a premises licence or summary is lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed, the holder of the licence may apply to the relevant licensing authority for a copy of the licence or summary. A fee of £10.50 is payable in relation to such an application.

Where an application is made for a replacement licence or summary the licensing authority must issue the holder of the licence with a licence or summary if it is satisfied that –

- (a) the licence or summary has been lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed; and
- (a) where it has been lost or stolen, the holder has reported that loss or theft to the police.

Surrender of premises licence

Where the holder of a premises licence wishes to surrender his/her licence he/she may give the licensing authority a notice to that effect. The notice must be accompanied by the premises licence, or where that is not practicable, by a statement of the reasons for the failure to provide the licence. Where a notice of surrender is given, the premises licence lapses on receipt of the notice by the licensing authority.

Death, incapacity, insolvency of licence holder

A premises licence lapses if the holder of the licence -

- (a) dies,
- (a) becomes mentally incapable (within the meaning of section 13(1) of the Enduring Powers of Attorney Act 1985)
- (b) becomes insolvent,
- (c) is dissolved, or
- (d) if it is a club, ceases to be a recognised club

Documentation can be provided along with photographic evidence, videos of the comings and goings of the Cubar.

The licence at present is that no music, recorded or live shall be permitted to be play outside after 11.00pm. Please see attached, highlighted areas for further information, on all points in the licence that they must adhere to. They have shown no interest is abiding to this current licence. I can only imagine how it would be if the licence were to be extended, permitting music to be played and persons been allowed outside until 1am.

There are other pubs within the High Street, Sandbach, who have to adhere to a licence of no music and people outside at the beer garden after 10.30pm. This is due to them being in a residential area. I see this as no difference. The Cubar is situated in a residential area.

On a personal matter, I have severe mental health problems. I suffer from depression, anxiety, also diagnosed with Borderline Personality Disorder. My anxiety is at another, higher level due to the Cubar.

On several occasions I have had to contact the establishment either by phone call, messages to the owner, who is not the named licensee Mr Phil Bebington. Or and if this has not been successful, I have had to go down to the bar in person to complain about the noise. Which to be honest has been shocking, as I have been verbally abused by Mr Phil Bebington and his wife Yosleydy Lopez.

It's not only the noise, that is of great concern to me, there are several other concerns, for example overflowing bins, with food waste exposed to the elements. Bottles and glasses left outside the premises. Cigarette buds that litter the street. Vomiting on or very near my front door.

Also the noise of the customers leaving the establishment are loud, screaming, swearing and very intoxicated.

I urge you and the panel to look into this issue of amendments to the said premises licence further as a matter of urgency.

As mentioned my anxiety is at a high level due to this matter.

I dread every weekend, knowing that the Cubar is open, knowing that they will be breaching their current licence.

My flat is my safe place. I live alone, with hardly any friends or family nearby.

Along with fearing for my own safety, I have a dog and cat, which I dread letting them out of an evening when the establishment is open, as I am afraid of what will happen to them, due to the customers being intoxicated, loud and somewhat aggressive.

This is mostly due to my mental health, worrying, overthinking, emotional and being afraid.

I have been witness to a fight taking place right outside my door.

I have had continuous experience of customers knocking on my door.

I've walked out of my home to let the dog out, to a customer urinating on my doorstep.

Bottles, and glasses left on or around my doorstep.

Vomit nearby my doorstep.

I have complained on many occasions to Cheshire East Licensing authority, Environmental Health, and the Police with regards to the above complaints.

I, as a resident should have the right to feel safe, and happy, in my own home, not constantly battling with an establishment, owners, customers, and the aftermath each and every weekend.

Please could you look into this as a matter of urgency.

I am also actively in touch with Amanda Andrews, with whom I am messaging with regards to a complaint that I made to Cheshire East Licensing authority before the said date of Cubar requesting to amend their licence.

On many occasions i have had to keep all my doors and windows closed summer or winter, i have had to turn up the volume on the tv to try and drown out the booming music, I have slept downstairs hoping it is a bit quieter upstairs i have even tried sleeping with ear plugs this can not be right it is very stress full its like a nightmare i feel like a prisoner in my home, i sometimes even blocking up landing window and at times sleeping away from home.

Living about 20 mt from the property with a clear line of sight many times i have had to clear up broken glasses and bottles from my driveway behind my gate one time empty cooking oil

tubs which had fat residue my dog could have eaten.

I have seen people from there being sick on driveway and doorways some even urinating at the back absolutely disgusting behaviour.

On a personal note i am retired through poor health i need my sleep and rest i am have a on the heart transplant list in the QE hospital Birmingham i have an LVAD fitted to assist me it is very important to keep my stress levels to a minimum I have rung licencing two or three times very little help,i get told its a night time economy and i have to put up with it.

this puts you of complaining as no one seems to be interested I thought cheshire east council promote sandbach as a quiet little market town I have lived in my property over 40 years and am sandbach born and bred and have never had any problems with any licensee utill now
