Overview

Exciting initiative we are rolling out across Cheshire as part of our ongoing commitment to tackle Violence and Intimidation against Women and Girls.

The Police & Crime Commissioner for Cheshire, Mr John Dwyer, has secured £1.5 million of funding from the Home Office for a number of innovative projects that will be rolled out across Cheshire by September 2023.

The project consists of various elements including training in the education sector, NTE, wider community, promotion of a safety app, extension of the use of GoodSAM and deployment of safety vehicles in the NTE.

Very tight timescales – two thirds of the project to be delivered by March 2023.

Safety App – Hollie Guard

Hollie Guard is a next generation smartphone app that provides enhanced levels of protection.

Amongst many other features, if the user is in danger, with a simple shake or tap it activates Hollie Guard immediately notifying your chosen contacts, pinpointing your location and sending audio and video evidence directly to their mobile phones.

Those in the community are to be advised of the availability of Hollie Guard. Offer to assist them to download it through their app stores, or direct them to hollieguard.com

The App is free to download, with much of the functionality available free of charge.

- Visitors to the bus and others in the community should be advised of the availability of Hollie Guard. Offer to assist them to download it through their app stores, or direct them to hollieguard.com
- The App is free to download, with much of the functionality available free of charge.
- The 24/7 monitoring is a paid for service. A later roll out will see the availability of voucher codes made available for sharing with victims and vulnerable people.
- Local officers to send through list of organisations and charities that work with vulnerable woman and girls who can assist with distribution of the vouchers. (Training to be arranged asap).
