They can be used to provide guidance for development on specific sites, or on particular issues, such a design. SPDs are capable of being a material consideration in planning decisions but are not part of the development plan. They must be consistent with national planning policy, must undergo consultation and mu in conformity with policies contained within the Local Plan.         The council has prepared a final draft Environmental Protection SPD for consultation. The draft SPD provide additional guidance primarily on the implementation of policy SE 12 ('Pollution, Land Contamination and Lan Instability'), in the council's Local Plan Strategy, adopted in July 2017. This includes the availability of documents, how residents and stakeholders will be notified etc. The council's Local Plan consultation database, which will be notified of the consultation, also includes a number of organisations who work alongside groups with protected characteristics in the borough. Consultation has taken place on the first draft SPD, and all comments received have been reviewed and considered whilst preparing the final draft of the document. A report of consultation has been prepared and will be published alongside the final version of the SPD, which will also be subject to further consultation.
