The Licensing Committee

The full Licensing Committee consists of fifteen elected Members of the Council. From this full Committee will be drawn sub-committees of three members to deal with licensing functions under the Licensing Act 2003. The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Licensing Committee shall have the discretion to refer a matter up to a hearing of the full Licensing Committee.

Officers at Hearings

- The Committee Officer introduces all parties and records the proceedings
- **The Legal Adviser** provides independent advice to the Members on legal matters and procedure.
- **The Licensing Officer** will introduce the matter and outline the application; the officer will also answer any questions Members may have.

PROCEDURE

NOTE: If the Sub-Committee has not already elected a Chairman, that will be the first item of business.

<u>Notes</u>

- 1. The hearing shall normally be held in public. There may be occasions on which the Committee find it necessary to exclude members of the press and public; any such decision will be taken on the basis that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing taking place in public.
- 2. The Chairman may require any person behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or (b) permit him/her to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify, but any such person may submit in writing any information which they would have been entitled to provide orally if they had not been required to leave.
- 3. Prior to the hearing each party shall have given notification and served documentation (eg statements of witnesses or reports of experts) as required. Late representations and evidence will only be considered with the agreement of all parties.
- 4. Anyone entitled to be heard may be represented by any person, whether or not that person is legally qualified.
- 5. Hearsay will be permitted but the Sub-Committee will be reminded to give it appropriate weight.
- 6. Due note shall be taken of the provisions of the Hearings Regulations 2005.
- 7. The Chair may, in the interests of expediency or convenience of the parties, vary the procedure from time to time, provided notice is given to the parties and the rules of natural justice are observed.

- **9 Local residents** (defined as interested parties) will be invited to present the bases of their objections, following which they can be questioned by all parties by way of clarification.

- **11** Committee/Sub-Committee withdraws to make its decision
- **12** Committee/Sub-Committee returns to announce its decision to all present.

1.0 Report Summary

1.1 The report provides details of an Application to Vary a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003 and the proposed operating schedule together with details of relevant representations received in relation to the application.

2.0 Recommendations

- 2.2 Acting in the capacity of Licensing Authority, Members must seek to promote the Licensing Objectives, and where Members consider matters have engaged one or more of the objectives, they may exercise their discretion.
- 2.3 Members of the Licensing Sub-Committee are reminded that they may not exercise discretion in any case, merely because it considers it desirable to, and should provide reason(s) for any decision taken, or where they might consider departing in any way from the Policy or Guidance.

2.4 Licensing Objectives / Guidance / Policy Considerations

2.4.1 The relevant representations engage the licensing objectives. The Sub-Committee in respect of this application is referred to the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, specifically those sections relating to the licensing objectives, premises licenses and hearings. The licensing objectives are (a) the prevention of crime and disorder; (b) public safety; (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and (d) the protection of children from harm.

2.5 **Statement of Licensing Policy**

- 2.5.1 Members should carefully consider the relevant sections of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 2.6 Members are reminded that should any conditions be added, they should be practical, enforceable and appropriate to promote the Licensing Objectives.
- 2.7 Finally, Members are also reminded that in determining the application in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, Members must also have regard to:
 - The rules of natural justice
 - The provisions of the Human Rights Act 1998

6.1 The Licensing Authority has adopted a Statement of Licensing Policy in accordance with section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 and Guidance issued under section 182 of the Act.

7.0 Financial Implications

7.1 Not applicable.

8.0 Legal Implications

- 8.1 In accordance with the provisions of section 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 the Licensing Authority must, having regard to the representations, take such steps (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. Section 18(4) provides that the authority may:
 - (a) Grant the licence subject to the relevant mandatory conditions and conditions consistent with the operating schedule
 - (b) Modify the application to such extent as the Authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives
 - (c) Exclude from the scope of the licence any of the Licensable Activities to which the application relates

(d) Refuse to specify a person in the licence as the Premises Supervisor (e) Reject the application.

9.0 Risk Management

9.1 Section 181 and Schedule 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 make provision for appeal to the Magistrates' Court of any decision made by the Licensing Authority.

10.0 Background and Options

- 10.1 The application, received on the 30th May 2013, is for the grant of a Variation of the Premises Licence under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 10.2 The operating schedule indicates that the proposed variation is as follows:
 - To extend the hours for all existing licensable activities.
 - To extend the opening hours of the premises.
 - To add the provision of Late Night Refreshment.
 - Structural alterations to the layout of the premises.
- 10.3 The hours applied for are as follows:
 - Sale and Supply of Alcohol Sunday to Thursday 08:00 to midnight Friday and Saturday 08.00 to 01:30 hours
 - All Existing Regulated Entertainment Sunday to Thursday 08:00 to midnight Friday and Saturday 08.00 to 01:30 hours
 - Late Night Refreshment
 Sunday to Thursday 23:00 to midnight
 Friday and Saturday 23:00 to 01:30 hours
 - Opening Hours of the Premises Sunday to Thursday 08.00 to 00.30 hours Friday and Saturday 08.00 to 02.00 hours
- 10.4 A copy of the application form is attached as Appendix 1 of this report.
- 10.5 A copy of the existing Premises Licence Summary and Conditions is attached as Appendix 2 of this report.
- 10.6 The Designated Premises Supervisor is Mujdat Karatas.
- 10.7 Relevant Representations

Responsible Authorities:

- 10.7.1 The Police Licensing Officer states: Can I take this opportunity to acknowledge receipt of the following application to which the police make no representations: Application to vary a Premises Licence Horseshoe Inn, Sandbach Road, Lawton Heath End, Church Lawton, Stoke on Trent, ST7 3RA.
- 10.7.2 The Environmental Health Officer states: Date received: 30.05.13 name of applicant: The Horseshoe Inn, address to which application relates: Sandbach Road, Lawton Heath End, Church Lawton, Stoke-On-Trent, ST7 3RA. Proposed Conditions: the following conditions should be applied for the Prevention of Public Nuisance: All necessary steps shall be taken to ensure that any noise from the premises shall not be at a level which could cause a noise nuisance at the boundary of the nearest residential premises, therefore:
 - Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby residents.
 - Refuse such as bottles shall be disposed of from the premises at a time (i.e. between 08:00 to 20:00) when it is not likely to cause a disturbance to residents in the vicinity of the premises.
 - There shall be placed at all exits from the premises in a place where they can be seen and easily read by the public, notice requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly.
 - Whilst regulated entertainment is taking place indoors, all windows and doors shall remain closed.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that assessments of noise from the premises shall be undertaken by a competent person (either the Licensee or Manager) and any necessary remedial action is undertaken to ensure compliance. These assessments shall be undertaken during opening hours of the premises and when entertainment or music is occurring. A written record shall be made of those assessments in a log book, kept for that purpose and shall include; the time and date of the checks, the person making them and the results including any remedial action.

The Licence Holder/Designated Premises Supervisor or responsible person nominated by him in charge of the Premises shall ensure that the Premises, including the car park, are vacated quietly within thirty minutes of the terminal hour of the Licence, and that proper supervision of all persons leaving the car park and otherwise leaving the Premises is provided. Conspicuous notices shall be positioned at all exits from the Premises requesting patrons to make the minimum amount of noise on leaving.



(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

Condition 2

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

Condition 3

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Condition 4

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Condition 5

The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

LICENSING ACT 2003 (MANDATORY LICENSING CONDITIONS) ORDER 2010

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Condition 1

(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

Condition 2

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

Condition 3

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Condition 4

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Condition 5

The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. Any person excercising a security activity (as defined by paragraph 2(1)(a) of schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001) shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 2. Such a person will be employed at the premises at the discretion of the designated premises supervisor/holder of the Premises Licence.
- 3. Any person as defined in condition (1) will clearly display his name badge at all times whilst on duty.
- 4. No customer apparantly carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any times the premises are open to the public.
- 5. Where CCTV is installed with recording facilities such recordings shall be retained for a period of 30 days and made available within a resonable time upon request by the Police.
- 6. Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose.

Public Safety

- 7. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the fire officer from time to time.
- 8. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the building control officer.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 9. Where appropriate, prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 10. Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.

Protection of Children from Harm

- 11. Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter the premises after 9pm.
- 12. Where there is provided in the Premises an entertainment for children, or an entertainment at which the majority of the persons attending are children, then, if the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds one hundred, it shall be the duty of the person providing the entertainment to station and keep stationed wherever necessary a sufficient number of adult attendants, properly instructed as to their duties, to prevent more children or other persons being admitted to the building, or to any part thereof, than the building or part can properly accommodate, and to control the movement of the children and other persons admitted while entering and leaving the building or any part thereof, and to take all other reasonable precautions for the safety of the children
- 13. Where the occupier of the Premises permits, for hire or reward, the Premises to be used for the purpose of an entertainment, he shall take all reasonable steps to secure the observance of the provisions of condition 12 above.







Amendment to license of Legh Arms, Knutsford

We understand that an application has been submitted to amend the license for the Legh Arms public house on Brook Street, Knutsford. A notice is posted on the building, though we note that there is no reference to this in the Premises License Applications section of the Cheshire East website.

We live opposite the Legh Arms and object to the proposed amendments.

We are disrupted on occasion by patrons leaving the Legh Arms who can be noisy. In addition, if the Legh Arms has live music, this can be clearly heard in our home, particularly if they leave their windows/door open. We are concerned that if the license were extended further that this nuisance would be far greater.

The Legh Arms is situated in a residential area, rather than the town centre near other non-residential buildings. Our children's bedrooms are situated at the front of our home, and face the Legh Arms. We feel that allowing the extension of the license will disturb many local residents, including us.

We have in the past received marketing literature from the current owners of the Legh Arms. Among other things it said they want "locals to feel ... valued". In the circumstances we feel this should include considering the impact the pub has on local residents.

We would ask that these points and the impact on local residents are taken into accoupt when considering the application made by the Legh Arms.

I understand your meeting took place on Monday evening with Mr Coulston from the Legh Arms. He has advised that your main concern relates to the live music provision being extended on this Licence. Mr Coulston understands your concerns and is more than happy to remove any extension to the current provision for live music at his premises.

In addition to the current conditions which already require that noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties, he would also volunteer a condition whereby during noise generating events, doors and windows shall remain closed save for access and egress after 21:00.

If there are any other issues which you would wish to see addressed, I would be most grateful if you could contact me.

Moving forward should any issues arise I am sure Mr Coulston would be more than happy to meet with you further and ensure that he retains a positive relationship with his neighbours.

Tim,

Thank you for meeting with me on Monday, and for providing a copy of the Licencing Application, which you say is to amend a long outdated licence. As I explained, I had not seen the formal application previously therefore didnt know the full extent of the proposed changes.

I hope you dont mind my response by email but I wanted to set out our suggested alterations to the application so that you can consider this. I had begun to prepare this prior to receipt of the letter from your solicitors.

I acknowledge the changes you wish to make and the suggestion that there was no real plan to do anything differently during evenings. I am however mindful of how any change might impact us, and further that if the pub were to change hands in the future that the new tenant may wish to abuse the longer opening hours. You will be aware we have had problems with noise due to patrons leaving the premises in the past. I am keen to resolve this amicably and with this in mind suggest the following (with reference to the application filed):

Sections 1-4:

no changes required

Section 5 - Films:

Provision of films may have a different meaning in the licencing world but I wasnt aware that any films were shown, hence why is there any need to change this? We would be willing to agree to an end time of 00:00 (midnight) every day. Similarly, I see no reason to extend hours in relation to Bank Holidays, Christmas etc. I did not understand the basis of seeking an additional hour in relation to British Summertime as I thought such changes took effect at 02:00 and would therefore be after your licenced hours anyway, but for the avoidance of doubt, this isnt agreed.

Section 6 - Sport:

I know you have sought to avoid showing some sporting events, particularly football. In the circumstances, and as above, I dont see the need to extend this past 00:00 midnight. I make the same points as above regarding Bank Holidays, Christmas and British Summertime.

Section 7 - Boxing:

no changes required

Section 8 - Live Music:

This was the key issue we had due to previous noise/disruption. I note you have suggested limiting this to 00:00 midnight as an end time every day, including Bank Holidays, Christmas and British Summertime. I agree to your suggestion. Further, I note that you agree that when live music is being played that all doors and windows should be closed.

Section 9 - Recorded Music:

I would like to be clear that this relates to incidental music rather than a DJ playing recorded music. I think it is reasonable to have incidental music during normal opening hours therefore see section 15 below. Please note this is not an agreement for disco/DJ as I consider that should follow the same lines as live music (section 8 above).

Section 10 - Dance:

Firstly I assume there is an error on the application as an end time of 02:00 is specified for Sunday, which is not in line with other parts of the application. In any event if this is a "performance of dance" I again think this should follow the timings suggested for live music, as it is likely to be accompanied by music and is a live act. On that basis, I dont see the need to extend this past 00:00 midnight. I make the same points as above regarding Bank Holidays, Christmas and British Summertime.

Section 11:

no changes required

Section 12 - Late night refreshment:

Extension agreed in principle but with the end time to follow that of supply of alcohol (see below). We would propose an end time of 00:30 for Monday to Sunday, and 01:00 on Friday and Saturday.

Section 13 - Supply of alcohol:

There is an error on the application in relation to Saturdays as two end times are proposed, I assume you were seeking 02:00. We have no objection to the start time of 08:00. The end time may however affect us if patrons are leaving the pub later as they can sometimes be noisy. We would propose an end time of 00:30 for Monday to Sunday, and 01:00 on Friday and Saturday. We agree to allow an extension to 01:00 on Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, the eve of Bank Holidays, but no amendment in relation to British Summertime.

Section 14:

no changes required

Section 15 - Opening hours:

Following the above points, we would agree opening at 08:00 but an end time of 01:00 Monday to Sunday, and 01:30 on Friday and Saturday. We agree to allow the extension to 01:30 on Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, the eve of Bank Holidays, but no amendment in relation to British Summertime.

Section 16 - objectives:

Reference should be made to the need to have doors and windows closed during live performances, and for staff to ensure/police that patrons leave the premises in an orderly fashion, as we discussed when we met recently.

I hope that this compromise is acceptable, though I would be willing to discuss further if you wish.

In view of the short timescales involved, I have copied this to the council and your solicitors.
