17 APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE - MORRISONS, STATION ROAD, NANTWICH, CHESHIRE CW5 5SP

The Sub-Committee considered a report regarding an application to vary a Premises Licence for Morrisons, Station Road, Nantwich..

The following attended the hearing and made representations with respect to the application:

- two representatives of the applicant
- a local resident

After a full hearing of the application and in accordance with the rules of procedure, the Chairman of the Sub-Committee reported that, after taking account of:

- The Secretary of State's Guidance under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003
- Cheshire East Borough Council's Statement of Licensing Policy
- The four licensing objectives (namely the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, and the protection of children from harm)
- All the evidence, including the oral representations made at the meeting and the written representations of interested parties, the following course of action had been agreed:

RESOLVED:

That the application for a variation to the Premises Licence, as amended by the applicant, be granted subject to the following conditions:

- all staff engaged in the sale of alcohol will receive suitable training in relation to the proof of age scheme “Challenge 25”
- Till prompts to be in use at store
- CCTV shall be provided on the premises and kept in good working order
- All checkout operators will operate a refusal log

The Applicant and Parties who had made relevant representations were reminded of their right to appeal this decision to the Magistrates Court within 21 days.
