Procedure for Hearings – Licensing Act 2003

The Licensing Committee

The full Licensing Committee consists of fifteen elected Members of the Council. From this full Committee will be drawn sub-committees of three members to deal with licensing functions under the Licensing Act 2003. The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Licensing Committee shall have the discretion to refer a matter up to a hearing of the full Licensing Committee.

Officers at Hearings

- The Committee Officer introduces all parties and records the proceedings
- The Legal Adviser provides independent advice to the Members on legal matters and procedure.
- The Licensing Officer will introduce the matter and outline the application; the officer will also answer any questions Members may have.

PROCEDURE

NOTE: If the Sub-Committee has not already elected a Chairman, that will be the first item of business.

Notes

- The hearing shall normally be held in public. There may be occasions on which the Committee find it necessary to exclude members of the press and public; any such decision will be taken on the basis that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing taking place in public.
- 2. The Chairman may require any person behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or (b) permit him/her to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify, but any such person may submit in writing any information which they would have been entitled to provide orally if they had not been required to leave.
- 3. Prior to the hearing each party shall have given notification and served documentation (eg statements of witnesses or reports of experts) as required. Late representations and evidence will only be considered with the agreement of all parties.
- 4. Anyone entitled to be heard may be represented by any person, whether or not that person is legally qualified.
- 5. Hearsay will be permitted but the Sub-Committee will be reminded to give it appropriate weight.
- 6. Due note shall be taken of the provisions of the Hearings Regulations 2005.
- 7. The Chair may, in the interests of expediency or convenience of the parties, vary the procedure from time to time, provided notice is given to the parties and the rules of natural justice are observed.

Summary of Procedure

- 1. Chairman appointed (if this has not been done previously).
- 2. Chairman to call for declarations of interest and request that all parties introduce themselves.
- 3. Chairman summarises the procedure for the hearing
- 4. The Licensing Officer summarises the application
- 5. Applicant to present his/her case.
- 6. Applicant to be questioned by all parties (to clarify points only) following which, he/she can clarify any other matters which he/she feels may have been misunderstood when the application was presented.
- 7. Applicant to be questioned by the Committee.
- 8. Responsible Authorities to make their representations following which they can be questioned by all parties by way of clarification.
- 9. Other Persons will be invited to present the bases of their objections, following which they can be questioned by all parties by way of clarification.
- 10. The applicant will be invited to sum up his/her case
- 11. Committee/Sub-Committee withdraws to make its decision
- 12. Committee/Sub-Committee returns to announce its decision to all present.

1. Report Summary

Friday and Saturday 23.00 – 02.00

The sale and supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises

Monday to Thursday 09.00 - 00.00

Friday 09.00 - 02.00

Saturday 10.00 - 02.00

Sunday 10.00 - 00.00

Additionally, the application seeks to:

To add non-standard timings on Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and the Sunday before a bank holiday, and to dis-apply the effect of the day of British Summer Time.

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

An additional hour on the day British Standard Time commences to dis-apply its effect.

An additional hour on the night of Christmas Eve

An additional hour on the night of Boxing Day

An additional 2 hours on a Sunday before a bank holiday.

To remove all existing licensing conditions and replace with new conditions, policies and an operating schedule.

- 5.4. Responsible Authorities:

- 6.1.3 Members are also reminded of the statutory obligation placed on the Local Authority under section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 to through all of its various functions, and Licensing is one of those functions to do all that it can to prevent Crime and disorder, Anti-social Behaviour, behaviour adversely affecting the environment and reoffending.

SMOKING & AL FRESCO DINING POLICY

- 1. Any outside area used by customers wishing to dine, drink or smoke shall be clearly delineated and covered by the CCTV system which will be installed at the premises.
- 2. The outside area shall be monitored by staff or door staff at all times it is in use
- 3. The area will be cleaned regularly
- 4. Suitable receptacles shall be provided for smokers to dispose of cigarette butts.
- 5. Signs will be displayed in the area requesting customers keep noise to a minimum.
- 6. Patrons who disregard signage and verbal instructions regarding noise will be asked to move inside and/or leave the premises.
- 7. Open containers of alcohol shall not be permitted to be taken beyond the boundary of the outside area



OPERATING SCHEDULE

Staff shall be trained in the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 with regard to the Licensing Objectives.

A) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. A CCTV system shall be maintained and operated at the premises with cameras positioned both internally and externally.
- 2. Recorded CCTV images will be maintained and stored for a period of twenty-eight days and shall be produced to the Police or Licensing Authority upon request.
- 3. CCTV will be in operation at any time a person is in the premises. Where CCTV is recorded onto a hard drive system, any DVDs subsequently produced will be in a format so it can be played back on a standard PC or DVD player.
- Any person left in charge of the premises must be trained in the use of any such CCTV equipment, and be able to produce CCTV images to an officer from a responsible authority upon request.
- 5. SIA registered door staff shall be employed at the premises, in accordance with a risk assessment, to be carried out by the DPS. When employed, door staff will wear high visibility armbands.
- 6. When employed, a register of those door staff employed shall be maintained at the premises and shall include:
 - (i) the number of door staff on duty:
 - (ii) the identity of each member of door staff;
 - (iii) the times the door staff are on duty.
- 7. Open containers of alcohol shall not be removed from the premises, save for consumption in any delineated external area.
- 8. Staff will be trained in the laws relating to under age sales, and that training shall be documented and repeated at 6 monthly intervals.
- 9. A refusals book will be maintained at the premises, and made available to an officer of a responsible authority upon request.

B) Public Safety

- 1. A first aid box will be available at the premises at all times.
- 2. Regular safety checks shall be carried out by staff.
- 3. Management shall liaise with the Fire Authority as necessary to ensure compliance with all necessary fire regulations.
- 4. The premises shall maintain an Incident Log and public liability insurance.

C) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

1. Noise from amplified music or voices shall not be such as to cause a noise nuisance to occupants of nearby premises.

- 2. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 3. The exterior of the building shall be cleared of litter at regular intervals.
- 4. Notices will be positioned at the exits to the building requesting customers to leave in a quiet manner.
- 5. Doors and windows at the premises are to remain closed after 11pm, save for access and egress.
- 6. A Dispersal and Smoking Policy will be implemented and adhered to (see attached).
- 7. The emptying of bins into skips, and refuse collections will not take place between 11pm and 7am.

D) The Protection of Children From Harm

- 1. A "Challenge 21" Policy shall be implemented in full and appropriate identification sought from any person who appears to be under the age of 21. The only acceptable forms of ID are photographic driving licences, passports, HM forces warrant cards, EU/EEA national ID card or similar document or a form of identification with the "PASS" hologram.
- 2. Staff training will include the Challenge 21 Policy and its operation. In particular, staff shall be trained to take such action as is necessary to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons over the age of 18 where those customers are engaged in the distribution of alcohol to persons under the age of 18. The training must be given to a new member of staff before they commence employment and all staff must receive refresher training every 6 months.
- 3. Notices advising what forms of ID are acceptable must be displayed.
- 4. Notices must be displayed in prominent positions indicating that the Challenge 21 policy is in force.

DISPERSAL POLICY

The purpose of this Dispersal Policy is to ensure, so far as it is possible, that minimum disturbance or nuisance is caused to our neighbours and to ensure that the operation of the premises makes the minimum impact upon the neighbourhood in relation to potential nuisance and anti-social behaviour. This will be achieved by exercising pro-active measures towards and at the end of the evening.

By ensuring that this Dispersal Policy document is brought to the attention of Management and Staff we will seek to encourage the efficient, controlled and safe dispersal of our patrons during our closing period.

- 1. At the end of the evening management and staff will assist with the orderly and gradual dispersal of patrons.
- 2. Staff Members (including door personnel when employed) will advise patrons to leave the premises quickly and quietly out of respect for our neighbours.
- 3. Notices will be displayed requesting our customers to leave quietly and in an orderly manner out of consideration to neighbours and their attention will be drawn to these notices by members of staff.
- 4. We will ensure the removal of all bottles and drinking receptacles from any patron before exiting the premises (this does not apply in the case of consumption in any delineated external drinking area.)
- 5. We will actively discourage our customers from assembling outside the premises at the end of the evening.

- b) Provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c) Provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period to 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d) Selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- e) Dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Condition 2

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Condition 3

- 1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 2. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- 3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - a) A holographic mark, or
 - b) An ultraviolet feature

Condition 4

The responsible person must ensure that –

a) Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

i. Beer or cider: ½ pint;

ii. Gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and

iii. Still wine in a glass: 125ml;

- b) These measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c) Where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2014

ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- c) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - i. the holder of the premises licence,
 - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - iii. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- e) 'valued added tax' means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2)The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. The premises will be alarmed.
- 2. Persons suspected of being drunk will not be served.

Public Safety

- 3. The restaurant will comply with the general law as to the safety of persons entering upon the premises.
- 4. Fire assessments will be regularly carried out by the Fire Officer and his recommendations will be implemented.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

5. Staff will be trained to monitor the premises so as to identify and quickly deal with any situations which may give rise to a public nusiance.

Protection of Children from Harm

- 6. Children will not be permitted entrance unless accompanied by an adult.
- 7. The restaurant will adopt and maintain the proof of age scheme; identification and proof of age will be required from anyone suspected of being under age.

General – All Licensing Objectives

8. Staff will be trained to supervise and monitor the premises so as to identify and quickly deal with any situations which may give rise to a breach of any of the licensing objectives.

- 1. The Licence Holder/Designated Premises Supervisor shall build relationships with local Police and Community Officers. Strong relationships continue with the Local Police and Community Officers. We are part of both the Pub Watch scheme and Arcangel.

- 3. Staff at the premises shall be trained, well selected and well informed. Staff are all trained. 3 of whom have Personal licences.
- 4. Qualified, trained and experienced door staff shall be employed if necessary.
- 5. A clear message shall be projected that drugs, violence and crime are not acceptable at any level.
- 6. Excessive or irresponsible drinking shall be discouraged, soft drinks and free tap water is available and we have a list of taxi numbers which we are happy to provide to customers or call taxis on their behalf.

Public Safety

- 7. Alcohol will not be served to anyone who appears to be drunk or to anyone on behalf of anyone who is drunk. The bar staff are trained and are aware of this. They have all had to sign on to the arcangel guidelines and policies. Violence is not tolerated at any level and if this occurs the managers are aware of how to deal with this promptly and efficiently so as to cause minimum risk of danger to the public.
- 8. Drink driving materials and taxi numbers shall be on display at the premises.
- 9. Staff shall be informed, trained and aware of activities in the premises which may be harmful to members of the public.

I write in relation to the application of The Botanist, King Street, Knutsford. I understand that Knutsford Town Council has voted to decline this application.

As a resident close to The Botanist I wish to support the vote of my council and OBJECT to this application.

I list my reasons below:-

There is already ample provision for alcohol and music beyond midnight within the town.

Noise from external activity (people drinking and smoking outside) at the Botanist already extends beyond 1am on Friday and Saturday (and beyond 12am Thursday) and any granting of an extension to licensing hours would mean noise, rowdiness and drunkenness being extended well beyond 1.30am which is unacceptable.

The Botanist has installed a number of televisions in the facility and are showing football matches. This indicates a need to attract a different clientele. This, I believe, reflects a downturn, or quietening, of business due to a wider (and sufficient) range of drinking and live music options within the town. Any extension of licensing hours is being applied for solely to address a downturn in business at the expense of a peaceful environment for local residents.

The area around the Botanist is more residential than, for example, Jack Rabbits, Kuckoo and Lost & Found where similar late drinking is currently licensed, and therefore there will be proportionally higher noise disruption felt if their licence is extended, than at those other bars.

I hope you will be able to support Knutsford Town Council and local residents by declining this application.



 impact on your activities. If the Planning Permission and the Premises Licence differ; for
 example where the Planning Authority have set a terminal hour which is earlier than those
 conditioned by the Premises Licence; you must abide by the earlier time otherwise you leave
 yourself open to enforcement action.

FOOD BUSINESS OEPERATIONS

Anyone starting a new food business must register with the Council at least 28 days before
you start any food operations. You can register your food business online via GOV.UK. If you
have premises in more than one local authority area, you must register with each authority
separately.
