t is anticipated that the works will commence on Friday 5 <sup>th</sup> August 2025 and will be completed by Friday 3 <sup>rd</sup> October 2025. Liaison will be undertaken with Cholmondeley Castle to mitigate the impact as a result of events during the works.
The alternative to undertaking these works at this time is to delay the works. This is likely to lead to continuing issues with temporary signals being vandalised / interfered with. It is unlikely to materially affect the impact on events at Cholmondeley Castle.
