The above will take place in accordance with the the C24110-CEH-HGN-ZZ-DR-C-900001 Consultation plan.

Should no objections be received during the objection period, or where objections are made and subsequently withdrawn, the proposed pedestrian crossing, Raised Table, and shared use footways/cycleways and cycle tracks will be implemented.

## Reasons for the Decision and alternatives considered

As part of a safety improvement to walking and cycling, Active Travel England have agreed to fund improvements along Manchester Road in Wilmslow between the junctions of Station Road and Stanneylands Road. The improvements will provide segregated cycle lanes, new tactiles to footpaths, surface improvement and new crossings facilities.

The proposed introduction of a raised table on Dean Drive will increase safety for pedestrians crossing over the existing uncontrolled crossing (dropped kerbs) and cyclists using the cycle facility on Manchester Road. This will slow motor vehicle traffic to a safe speed approaching the uncontrolled crossing. The proposed introduction of two controlled crossings (Toucan crossing) will give priority to pedestrians crossing the road and a section of shared use footway on Manchester Road. A combination of cycle lanes and shared use footways/cycleways will be installed along Manchester Road.

## <u>DETAILS OF ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS</u> CONSIDERED:

- 1. Don't proceed with the scheme, therefore none of the benefits are provided; or
- 2. Proceed with different proposals that put in different infrastructure, speed requirements

	and / or waiting restrictions – which would be less ambitious and might impact on future ATE funding.
	This scheme will incur capital costs as follows:  • Construction / installation: £310,000
	This cost will be funded from the Active Travel budget.
	The constructed scheme will create annual revenue costs as follows:  • Traffic signals and equipment: £3,674 per year (£55,110.00 over a 15-year period)
	A contribution from the scheme budget of £50,000 will be made for additional maintenance, with future costs beyond this being unfunded. Requirements for maintenance beyond the £50,000 contribution will therefore be funded by reductions in maintenance spend, prioritized within the existing highway maintenance budget according to the council's Highway Safety Inspections Code of Practice.
	The costs above are the costs relevant to this decision only. There are broader financial implications for proceeding with the scheme as a whole.
Member consultation and interests declared	Cheshire Constabulary (Robin Johnson, Traffic Management Officer on behalf of Cheshire Constabulary) was consulted on the proposed scheme on 26th June 2025 but raised no comments about the proposed crossings and raised tables.
	A public engagement event was held on 4 <sup>th</sup> July 2025, attended by the Ward Members and Handforth Parish Council. All attendees were in support of the proposals to introduce new cycling facilities on Manchester Road.
