Parish Council	No	Mobberley Parish Council discussed the proposed expansion of Mobberley CE Primary at their meeting held on 6th November and I can advise that the following this discussion , the members have serious concerns about the increase in school numbers from 140 to 210 with effect from September 2013. The main reasoning behind this objection is as follows:- - The increase in pupils will result in traffic congestion on the country road on which the school is situated. Some larger primary schools do utilise coach companies to transport children to their school which could increase the congestion along Church Lane - With the expansion of the school it is considered that there will be a lack of parking facilities - The increase in the number of children will change the overall ethos of the school - Mobberley Primary School has always been classed as a small country school and has been attended by many of the children from the village. With the increase in numbers the extra spaces will encourage more people from outside Mobberley to attend the school. - The increase in spaces at the local school may encourage the expansion of the village. Mobberley has increased in size over the past years and any further increase would not be welcome. - As this is a Church of England School, the

School Staff	Yes	I feel it is not right that at the moment children from families who live in Mobberley village are being turned away from the school and forced to travel further afield. As a member of the teaching staff and as a former Parent of 2 children, I would be delighted to see the school expand to single year groups, max 30 children per class. At this new size I believe the school will still be able to maintain its family feel whilst providing children with a larger social circle and smooth transition to the local high schools. 2 new classrooms will offer early years and lower key stage 1 children a fabulous up to date learning environment while allowing other classes more space - we are currently extremely short of space.

All children in the catchment area who wish to attend their local village school should be able to do so, thereby securing community cohesion for the future. I believe expansion is the right and only way forward.

School Staff/ Governor	No objection	Comments sent on behalf of the Head Teacher and Governors of nearby school. Although the Mobberley School site is not ideal for an increased population there is no basic objection to some expansion there. However, it is important that the infrastructure of all local schools remains robust and that any expansion of Mobberley is not at the expense of other schools. The reasons for this are: 1. At the moment there is a good geographical spread of schools which is good for the provision of school places and Parental choice. 2. There is a bulge in population which applies to the whole area and is not restricted in its geographical impact. 3. There are proposals for residential development in the area and whilst it is not likely that all the proposed sites will go ahead, nevertheless there will be some increase in population in different parts of Knutsford. However, housing development does not always generate anticipated numbers of school children so expansion of one school should be considered carefully when there are places available at other schools in the area. 4. Manor Park School provides for a special area in Knutsford, which includes a high proportion of social housing, and the school has developed specialism which is not available to the same extent in all the other local schools.
