
Vulnerable Persons Housing Strategy Consultation

Introduction

Cheshire East is developing a housing strategy to specifically cater for the needs of vulnerable people within the Borough, and wants to ensure that the views of constituents and other key stakeholders are reflected in this work.

The vulnerable persons housing strategy will set the priorities, direction, and actions designed to improve the performance and choice of specialist housing and related accommodation services for vulnerable people. It will do this by painting a picture of the accommodation landscape, mapping demand from residents against supply and assessing gaps.

The strategy outlines at a high-level the outcomes that Cheshire East wants to drive for vulnerable people's housing, as well as providing the evidence base that has informed these outcomes. The strategy and its action plan will shape all subsequent work involving the provision of vulnerable persons housing: individual policies and service objectives will form to incite the outcomes identified in the strategy, and the strategy will inform the future commissioning of housing and accommodation support services.



The strategy will focus on eight primary vulnerable groups, which will each be the subject of a chapter in the strategy. These are listed below in the order they appear in the strategy; this does not reflect any system of priority given to these groups:

- Older People
- Learning Disabilities
- Mental Health Issues
- Cared for Children and Care Leavers
- Drug and Alcohol Issues
- Physical and Sensory Disabilities
- Domestic Abuse
- Homelessness

Your Role and Views

Your contribution and response to this consultation will shape the eventual strategy, and subsequently all policy and commissioning decisions made surrounding vulnerable persons housing.

The strategy is currently in draft format based on initial analysis of the evidence base and consultation with internal Council services and a cross-section of wider partners and providers. This draft will continue to be refined in response to the input of stakeholders, including your response to this consultation.
