1. Report Summary

1.1. To update the Committee on the review of the Council's 2018 Annual Status Report, the purpose of the report is to ensure Members are aware of the report before submission to DEFRA and to provide comments as appropriate.

5. Background

5.1 The 2018 Annual Status Report (ASR) provides an overview of air quality in Cheshire East during 2017 and it fulfils the requirements of Local Air Quality Management (LAQM) placed on the Council as set out in Part IV of

the Environment Act (1995) and the relevant DEFRA Policy and Technical Guidance documents.

- 5.2 The LAQM process places an obligation on all local authorities to regularly review and assess air quality in their areas, and to determine whether or not the air quality objectives are likely to be achieved. Where an exceedance is considered likely the local authority must declare an Air Quality Management Area (AQMA) and prepare an Air Quality Action Plan (AQAP) setting out the measures it intends to put in place in pursuit of the objectives.
- 5.3 The Annual Status Report (ASR) is an annual requirement setting out results of monitoring, strategies employed by Cheshire East Borough Council to improve air quality and any progress with regards to actions contained in the Council's AQAP.
- 5.4 To date the Council has completed all of the previous air quality submissions to DEFRA, and they have all been approved. This ASR responds to the comments provided by DEFRA to the 2017 ASR, 2017 monitoring results and an update regarding any new Air Quality Management Areas (AQMAs) as recommended in the 2017 report.
- 5.5 The 2018 ASR, recommends that a further two AQMAs are declared for a small area of Chelford Road, Knutsford and part of Lewin Street, Middlewich. Whilst modelling data has suggested there may not be a need to declare these areas, the Council is taking the precautionary approach and declaring based on the monitoring data.
- 5.6 It should also be noted that the Council has decided that this year the final draft report should be reviewed by and external consultant. This was undertaken by Bureau Veritas and their comments, will be incorporated in to the final report.

6. Implications of the Recommendations
