	Re the proposal... why on earth do you not build a new school for all the special children ?? and the amount more that you will have in the near future? there WILL be many more...because just as numbers have risen over these 10 plus years, so they will again....autism went from 20 years ago 1 in 10,000 to 1 in 36 boys..... Also, will church lawton school for autism be making a class or 2 for the lower functioning children? As I asked the head master a year or so ago? Will they now be opening their doors to pupils slightly less able to pass exams like my son now? Church Lawton that lovely new school for Autism but only if they have high functioning Autism? Yet again the slightly lower functioning children get crammed into special schools that are not/ were not geared up for Autism...this autism we see now (which is infact ALL vaccine injury) Where will park lane get all these new students? what age group will they be? does anyone at cheshire east for schools actually understand the implications of providing a classroom as small as those roomsare full of autistic and other special children means???? Staff are stretched now? I asked for my son to have a one on one, which most of these children do in fact really need ...but they have not enough staff I was toldwhere will the resources of care come from for another 40 pupils???? will you build a new wing at least? because you CANNOT crowd autistic children in small spaces and expect it to work for them (it is 1 in 36 boys now being diagnosed on the spectrum in the UK and that was a 2014/5 figure..If the numbers are rising), these children DO NOT do well in chaotic situations..in crowds and with noise...some of them are already coping with extreme stress of a class of 10 or 12 children? This is not going to work for these children. And I for one will take my son out of park lane school if the numbers rise in his tiny class room..with 1 to 3 ratio.. staffing, I'll (and that isn't always happening either) and were I to remove my son cheshire east can pay his private tutor fee I can promise this much ..and I will then write to the papers about the inadequate funding and resources for these children.... That school is full to the brim already, it is also special needs which makes it all the more important to not cause distress to the pupils, and this proposal will... Believe me as a mother of an autistic individual and a friend of 100 more parents with the same issues in life..if cheshire east cram more children into park lane you will be causing the suffering of so many young children who cannot cope with that sort of over crowding, pupil noise and under staffing..I Do the right thing..I BUILD A NEW PREMISES I either on the college carpark that is half empty half the time or build another wing that backs over that way.....or another site altogether.... It seems Kings school can devastate the countryside at Cheshire east's go ahead...but you cannot provide a caring, uncrowded and appropriate setting for the disabled children? shame on you I shame on you otherwise and I won't let these children suffer if I can do something about it. Provision is needed for school places near to a child's home, limiting the amount of travelling and importantly providing them with an education within their own community, not in a town miles away. 	This has been needed for some time, many local young people are being turned away and having to go out of county or attend educational settings which are not right for them. I would ask that the new building is equipped with ceiling tracking and hoisting equipment so that the most profoundly disabled children are able to move around easily and with dignity. The existing school building has no ceiling tracking and unwieldy portable hoists are used which limits the ability of children with PMLD to move about the school. I would also ask that some money is put aside to make good and decorate the existing school buildings which are, through no fault of the staff at the school, falling into disrepair (it's simply down to how they have to manage such a tight budget). In terms of how the overall, expanded building is used, I would suggest that the space is used sensibly based on pupils' physical abilities and that classrooms used to educate the most able bodied children need to be set out differently in terms of space available, equipment, etc to classrooms where profoundly disabled children need a calmer, more sensory-led environment. There is currently a class for primary age pupils with PMLD (Barnaby) and I would suggest, as increasing numbers of pupils come into school, that this provision will need to be expanded and hoisting equipment installed (which is why, perhaps, this class should be part of the new building where this lifting and sensory equipment can be installed from scratch). I would also plead with Cheshire East Council again not to develop a shiny new part of the building and ignore the maintenance needs of the existing building. Finally, we also need to make sure the new part of the building is joined up to the existing school building if possible, so that staff and pupils feel part of the overall school organisation and not separate. I would like to see plans as the 3 page consultation document has no detail at all. I would be very keen to take part in consultation with CEC planners / architects as a parent carer representative.
